Protesters offer to join IWA strike

Union leader spurns offer from Friends of the Elaho

The Friends of the Elaho (FE), a protest group that has intermittently stopped logging in the upper Elaho valley, are considering joining striking loggers on the picket lines in a show of support — support that the union doesn't want.

Members of the Industrial, Wood and Allied Workers of Canada in the coastal forest industry went on strike June 27 over stalled contract negotiations.

The strike put approximately 1,000 people out of work in the Squamish area, which is still recovering from a year-long mill closure that ended last July.

A picket line went up at the International Forest Products (Interfor) sawmill at 11 p.m. Tuesday after what mill manager Ron Sander described as "very orderly, professional" shutdown.

FE spokesperson Sharai Matatia said Wednesday the environmental group was looking into whether it can support the workers. She isn't sure what kind of opposition they would get from the IWA if they tried to join the picket line.

"We'd have to take a risk to find out," she said. "That could be one way of showing support for them as workers. The corporation we have a problem with."

Rob Otto, IWA chair for Interfor's Empire Logging Division, said Thursday the IWA has deliberately not put a picket line up in Tree Farm Licence 38 in order to avoid contact with protesters.

"It would be bizarre for us to even be around them. It could not be appreciated for

them to come around," he said.

"Believe me, they have no interest in helping us."

"They're better going to Victoria than hanging around us," Otto added, saying the issue is one of land use, not loggers versus preservationists.

In the meantime, Interfor is taking advantage of the IWA strike to do work on two electrical transformers that would have required a shutdown of the sawmill.

The IWA is co-operating, letting any operations crucial to safety occur, IWA mill chairman Doc Halliday said Thursday on the picket line.

All sides are concerned about the long-term effects of the strike.

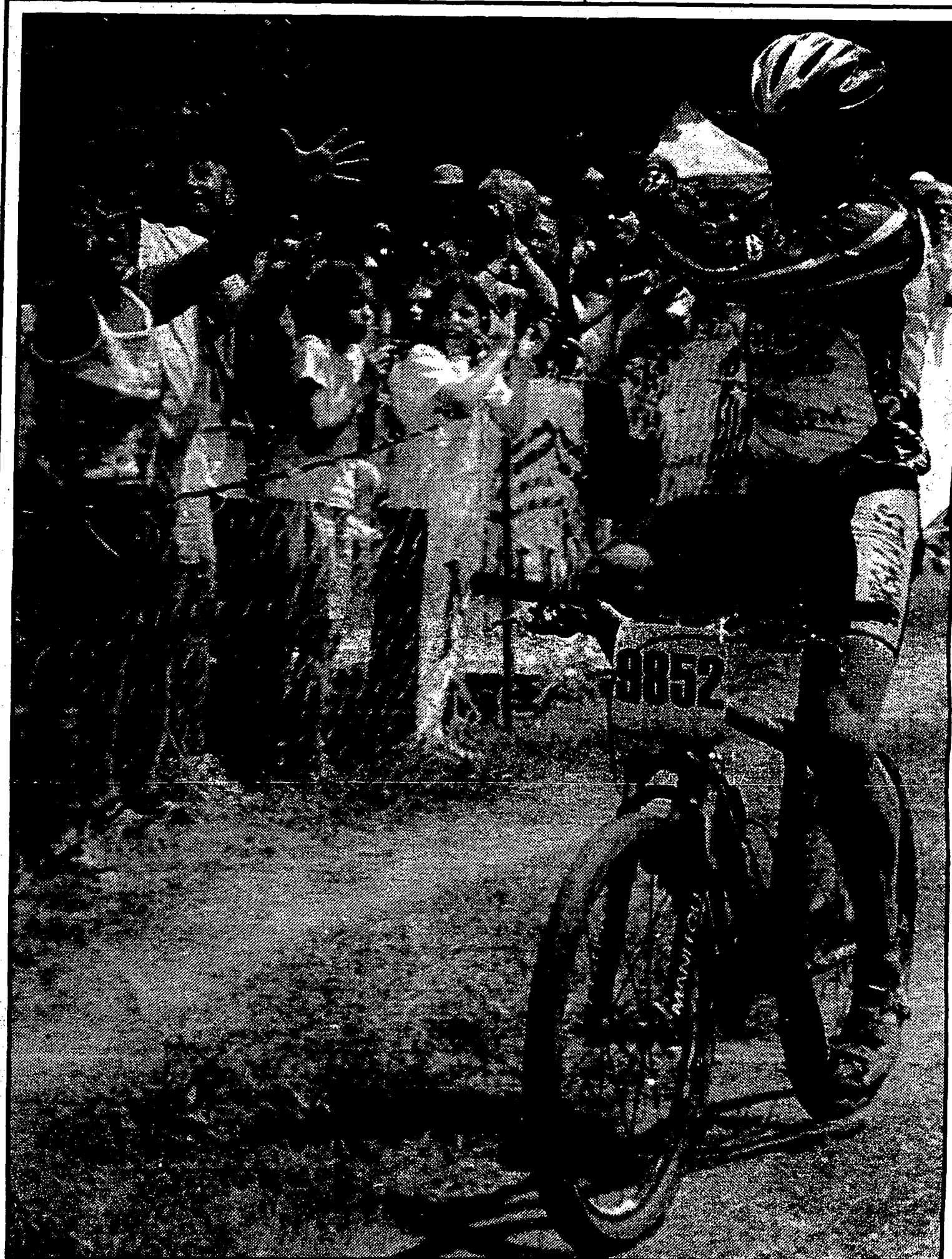
Sander described pulling B.C.'s products from the overseas markets as being like pulling a bucket of water out of the ocean — the hole fills in immediately.

"People like the Scandinavians, the Chileans, the New Zealanders pick up some of our market share. We have a really hard time getting that back," he said.

"There's a lot of good products out there, and most of them are cheaper than ours."

"I'm not pointing fingers at who's to blame for us being on strike ... but our communities depend on the monies generated by this industry over these summer months," said Otto.

The negotiations for a new contract — the old one expired June 15 — are sticking mainly on issues related to shift scheduling, requirements to take vacations and employers' pension plan contributions and employee benefits.

Upcoming issues for the July 4 meeting of council at 3 p.m. in council chambers at Municipal Hall:

Council will consider a request from a delegation from the dental and medical community in Squamish to hold a referendum on reintroducing fluoride into the municipal water supply.

Elaho protester under house arrest

International Forest Products (Interfor) is back in B.C. Supreme Court today seeking another injunction against protesting in the upper Elaho Valley, and a protester arrested in the area two weeks ago is now under house arrest.

The trial of nine anti-logging protesters arrested last year continues this week. They are charged with criminal contempt of court after violating a now-defunct injunction against interfering with Interfor's operations.

Two of those nine were arrested again June 20 for being in the Elaho, a breach of their bail conditions. They were released the next day with additional conditions.

Rick McCallion is now restricted to the Vancouver-Richmond area, while Reasha Wolfe is restricted to her residence, except for appearances

at Vancouver Supreme Court.

The trial resumed June 26 with the completion of defence lawyers' cross-examination of Interfor engineer David Haffey. Haffey put the trial on hold after apparently committing perjury about how a videotape he made of a violent confrontation between loggers and environmentalists Sept. 15 ended up in Lava Creek gorge.

He was excused to find legal counsel and subsequently sought treatment for mental distress, delaying his return.

The first witnesses the defence called were Interfor's vice-president of coastal forest operations, Hugh Sutcliffe, and Empire Logging Division operations manager Dave Miller. So far, however, only Sutcliffe has made it to the stand. The trial is expected to last about another week.

How long it will take Interfor to get a new injunction is even less certain.

The case will be heard by Chief Justice Donald Brenner, who along with two other judges earlier denied Interfor's requests for an interim injunction.

On June 7 Justice David Vickers threw out the original injunction, granted last August, saying "Vigilante actions, misrepresentations and lies have followed the granting of the injunction."

However, Vickers noted Interfor's reasons for seeking an injunction were sound, though the courts would prefer to see the Criminal Code used instead of civil litigation to stop work disruptions.

Interfor chief forester Ric Slaco said Friday the only new elements in the company's case are the escalating nature of the protests, video and photographic evidence of work disruptions, signed affidavits and the training given to the crews on avoiding confrontations.

Slaco said protesters were entering active work zones, making their presence known with high-visibility vests and whistle blasts. He noted a whistle blast is traditionally a logger's distress signal.

"We think we've demonstrated our ability to act appropriately when faced with illegal protests," he said. "Not only were the people being prevented from working, it was being done in a manner that was unsafe for both the workers and the protesters."

"The main message is that we just want to go to work unobstructed."

Interfor announced the lay-off of 16 loggers June 28, blaming it on protesters. As they can now apply for unemployment insurance, the laid-off loggers are actually in a better position financially than the workers who went on strike June 27, as strike pay is not issued for the first two weeks.

Fire averted in Upper Squamish

Quick action by an employee is being credited for saving a home from major fire damage in the Upper Squamish area June 20.

Acting Fire Chief Ray Saurette said a fire at a bed and breakfast at about 18.5 Mile in the Upper Squamish

was called in to Squamish Fire Rescue just after 9 a.m.

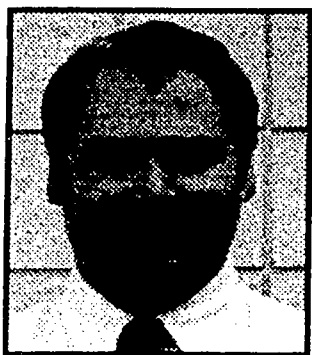
Saurette said a cook out for a morning walk saw smoke coming from one of the bedrooms and took action.

"He grabbed a garden hose,

put it through the window and called for more help," Saurette said. "By the time we arrived the fire had been put out, but we just made sure that nothing else was still smoldering."

CHIPS back in court

The lawsuit launched over the development of a wood chip reload facility on the Cattermole Slough was in court for the second time Friday, without resolution.

Lawyers for Citizens for a Healthy, Innovative and Prosperous Squamish (CHIPS) and lawyers for the District of Squamish argued in B.C. Supreme Court in Vancouver June 30 about the awarding of a development permit to GBA Logging Ltd. by council on May 2.

However, they ran out of time before completing their arguments.

The case is expected to return to court July 7, depending on the judge's schedule.

WCWC camps in Victoria

The Western Canada Wilderness Committee's (WCWC) Wedge to the Ledge campaign, which involves wedges left from the harvesting of ancient trees in the upper Elaho Valley to Victoria in wheelbarrows, reached the legislature Thursday.

Premier Ujjal Dosanjh declined to meet the trekkers during the rally the and other environmental groups held that day, citing a lack of time.

The WCWC is now maintaining a presence on the legislature's lawn with the wedges, in hopes the premier will find some time before the summer break.

Hydrant vandal sought

Squamish RCMP and Squamish Fire Rescue is on the lookout for a water hydrant vandal.

In the past week, vandals have opened fire hydrants in the Garibaldi Highlands and in Brackendale, causing considerable damage.

Acting Fire Chief Ray Saurette is asking the public to be on the lookout for any suspicious activity and to report anything to the police.

Squamish Nation to vote on SEMP deal

Squamish Nation council will vote this week on a deal that will ratify the Squamish Estuary Management Plan (SEMP) and transfer thousands of hectares and hundreds of thousands of dollars to the band.

A meeting to vote on the deal will be held tonight (July 4) at 6 p.m. at Totem Hall, following the meeting held Thursday in North Vancouver.

Should the deal be approved, the Squamish Nation will receive \$900,000 in cash, ownership of 28 hectares in the estuary's wildlife management area and the right to construct an interpretive centre in the estuary and co-manage the estuary (Site A). They will also get the opportunity to own a one-third interest in the deep sea port proposed by BC Rail for the east side of the Mamquam Blind Channel (Site B) with control over what materials it handles, and the option to acquire about 560 hectares of BC Rail and provincial land around Porteau Cove or 480 hectares in the Whistler corridor at fair market value.

The province has also agreed to support the band seeking reserve status for those lands.

The Porteau Cove lands are compensation for the Squamish Nation over the estuary lands, Mayor Corinne Lonsdale said Friday.

The District of Squamish was the

first party to approve the SEMP in May of last year.

In the time since, agreements under which the SEMP was subject needed to be worked out, said Lonsdale.

"I'm just hopeful it's the same document we signed a year ago," she said.

Lonsdale said, while the deep sea port is still just a proposal, this agreement means what happens on Site B will include the Squamish Nation.

The 1999 SEMP basically splits the estuary down the middle.

The 579-hectare conservation site encompasses both banks of the Squamish River from where the Mamquam River joins down to past the windsurfing spit.

The industrial-commercial area, covering 330 hectares, includes the area east of the BC Rail yard to the road to the spit, a thin section east of the downtown, all of Squamish Terminals and the heavy industrial south of downtown, and the east bank of the Mamquam Blind Channel up to Rose Park.

This makes the second agreement the band members must vote on. A \$92.5-million out-of-court settlement with the federal government over appropriated reserve lands goes to referendum July 23.

The deal between BC Rail, the province and the Nation, on the other hand, must be approved by way of a motion.

Local golf course trees ordered checked

At least 10 of 15 golf courses in the area between Vancouver and Whistler, including Squamish Valley Golf and Country Club, have been ordered by the Workers' Compensation Board to have their trees checked for potential hazards.

The orders were issued after the courses were

inspected by WCB officers over the last two weeks.

The inspections were spurred by the death May 28 of well-known Squamish resident Linda Carney when a 17-metre poplar, believed to have been rotten, fell onto the golf cart she was driving with husband Owen at the Rivershore Estates and Golf Links in Kamloops.

A day after the accident a WCB officer visited the golf course and ordered a

licensed arborist or a certified tree inspector be brought in to check on the safety of the course's trees and any found to be unstable be removed.

Orders for assessment and removal are issued only to those courses the inspections find to have potential hazards, as would be done in any workplace with trees, said Donna Freeman of the WCB.

A report on the arborists'

findings and the course's subsequent actions must be filed by July 15.

The WCB will be sending out a letter to employers, informing them about the issue of unsound trees and offering help in ensuring worker safety.

At Squamish Valley, however, the lesson was already learned.

By the time a WCB officer showed up at the course the links crew had already iden-

tified a number of hazardous trees and were falling them even as he did his inspection.

"We're a step ahead of them, so to speak," general manager Dave Woods said Saturday.

However, Squamish Valley must still bring in an arborist or tree inspector and make a report to the WCB.

Results of the inspections of Whistler Golf Club and Nicklaus North were unavailable at press time.

Power to the locals, says Nebbeling bill

MLA Ted Nebbeling has introduced a private member's bill to give local governments control over land use by Crown corporations.

But the bill will probably die on the order paper, the minister responsible said.

Cathy McGregor, minister of Municipal Affairs, said Friday it is unlikely the West Vancouver-Garibaldi Liberal's bill will be called for second reading.

The bill was given first reading on June 26; the bill will not be debated unless it comes up for second reading.

Nebbeling's bill would amend the Interpretation Act to require Crown corporations to abide by the bylaws of local government regarding land use, development and improvements. Currently, section 14 of the Interpretation Act allows the provincial government and Crown corporations to ignore municipal zoning.

"More and more times does the Crown overrule local land-use decisions," said Nebbeling Thursday.

"It is a much more democratic, much more effective way to deal with zoning applications from the Crown," he said of his bill.

"It's going to be interesting to hear the minister argue with this bill, considering for the last few years the minister says they have rewritten the Municipal Act to give more power to local governments."

"I don't support Mr. Nebbeling's bill," McGregor said. "I can say I support the intent of what he's trying to do, which is ensuring local government is adequately consulted."

McGregor said Nebbeling's bill would eliminate the province's ability to act in the broader public interest, as is necessary from time to time.

She also said the Ministry of Municipal Affairs has a standing policy of consulting with local government, and pointed out disputes are rare.

Nebbeling, however, can cite three such conflicts within his riding, at Horseshoe Bay, Whistler and Squamish.

Horseshoe Bay must deal with the expansion of the B.C. Ferries terminal, Whistler a gravel pit in a scenic corridor and Squamish a pumice plant.

The District of Squamish recently won an appeal of a Provincial Court ruling that allowed Great Pacific Pumice to continue operating a pumice rock stockpiling and processing plant on provincial land on Mamquam River Road, near the Squamish

Valley Rod and Gun Club.

District officials want Great Pacific Pumice to vacate the site, claiming the operation violates local bylaws. Great Pacific Pumice contends its provincially-issued permits allow it to operate on Crown land regardless of municipal bylaws, a position the B.C. Court of Appeal disagreed with. The district, which received \$10,000 for the case from the Union of B.C. Municipalities (UBCM), is waiting to see if the company will appeal the ruling.

"It's still necessary legislation be changed so we don't end up in court over this sort of thing," Mayor Corinne Lonsdale said Friday of the district's successful appeal.

She noted the UBCM had passed a motion put forward by Squamish that the Interpretation Act must be amended.

CanOxy cleanup work begins

The first major phase of remediation work at the CanOxy site was given a green light by Squamish council June 20 with the approval of two temporary waste storage cells.

The temporary industrial

use permit granted to Canadian Occidental Petroleum expires in two years. It is also subject to a \$10,000 bond to ensure the land is restored to its original condition after the soil storage and treatment cells are

removed.

The cells will be used in the cleanup of the Old Lagoon. Major sludges will be excavated and temporarily stored in the cement-lined cells before being trucked off to an approved landfill.

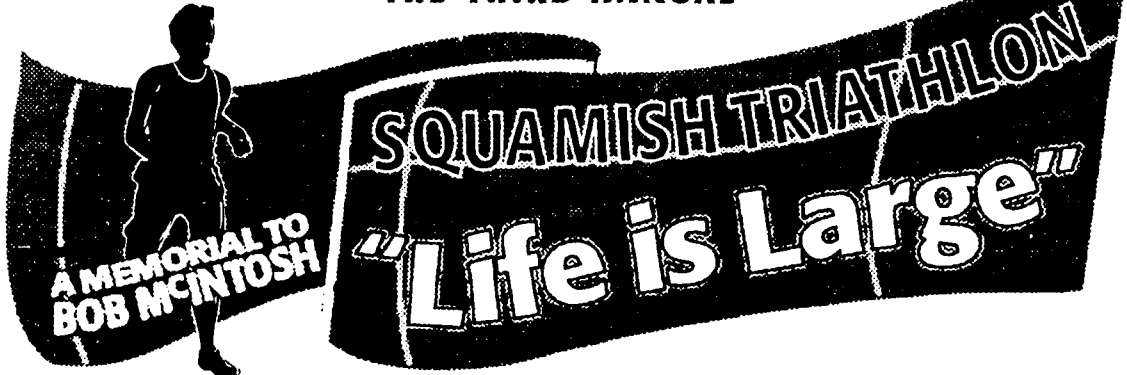

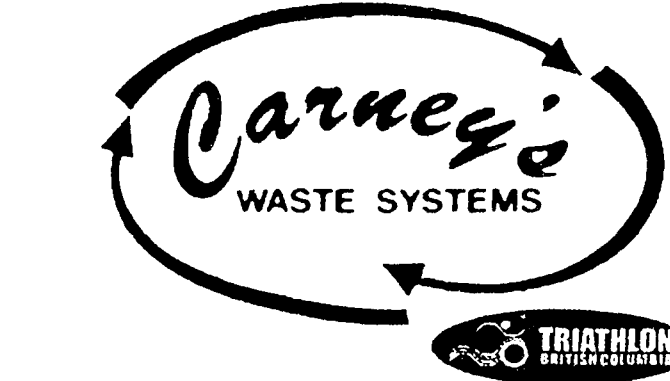

SAR rescues stranded horses

Squamish Search and Rescue (SAR) crews continued their busy string of calls last Thursday when they were asked to assist in rescuing several horses.

Just after 3:30 p.m. on June 22 a caller reported to Squamish RCMP that several horses were floating in the Mamquam River as they had become tangled in some brush.

Police, SAR and BC Ambulance Service made their way to the scene.

"Two horses had made it to shore while a third horse had its head held above water by an unknown female," said RCMP Const. Allison Good. "The third horse was able to

eventually untangle itself and was pulled ashore."

Good said SAR didn't enter the water to assist and all the horses involved were shaken up, but uninjured in the incident.

On June 25 just before 3:30 p.m., police responded to a complaint in the Deeks Creek area of 11 hikers at the trailhead being chased by an extremely aggressive black bear.

No one was injured as a result of the incident and conservation officers were called to look for the bear.

Good said conservation officers searched the area, but the bear was not found.

"This is a reminder to the public to be aware of black bears in our area and to be

cautious when hiking in the woods," Good said.

For more information on bear safety call the Conservation office at 898-2154.

Just after 12 p.m. on June 28, police received a complaint of mischief, break and enter at the Britannia Beach Mining Museum.

Unknown suspects gained access to a tunnel attached to the museum by using an axe on the door.

No items were taken, however several pieces of machinery were tampered with resulting in minor damage.

Police are still investigating.

An \$1,800 mountain bike was stolen from a Skyline home on June 27.

The bike was locked up outside and was stolen just after 7 p.m.

The bike was dark green in color with rock shocks, a mud fender and carrier and was a Rocky Mountain 24-speed bike. Police have no suspects.

A Squamish man received minor injuries after rolling his dirt bike.

On June 27 just after 2 p.m., police and ambulance crews were called to the accident near the Squamish Forest District office near Centennial Way.

When emergency crews arrived the man had already been taken to Squamish General Hospital.

He was issued a ticket for having no insurance, but no other charges were laid.

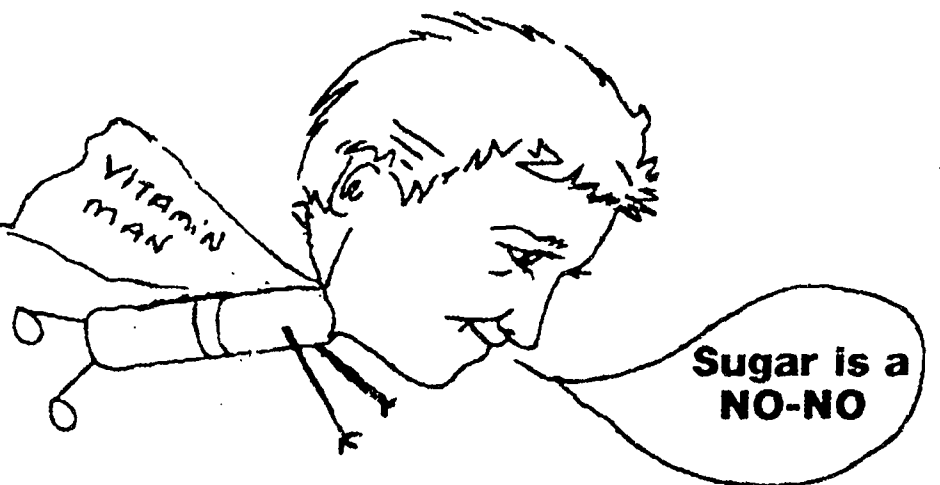

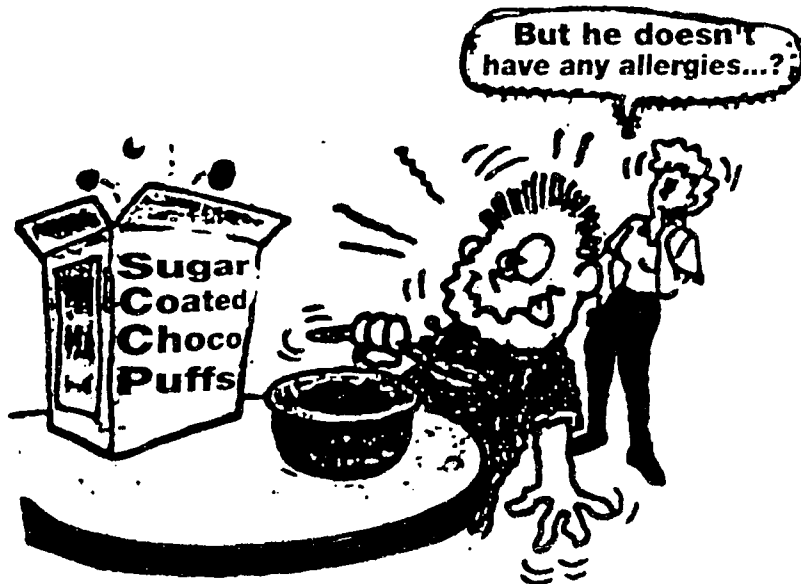

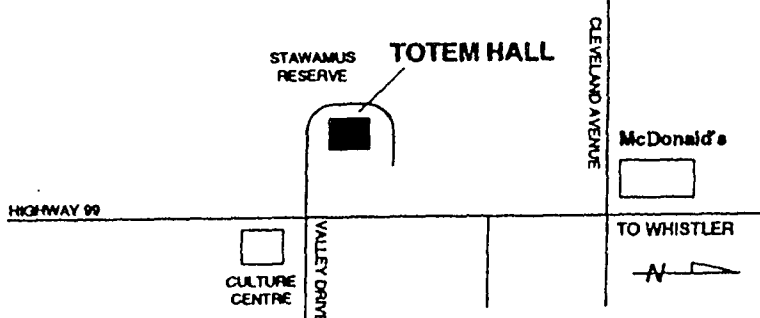

Over to you

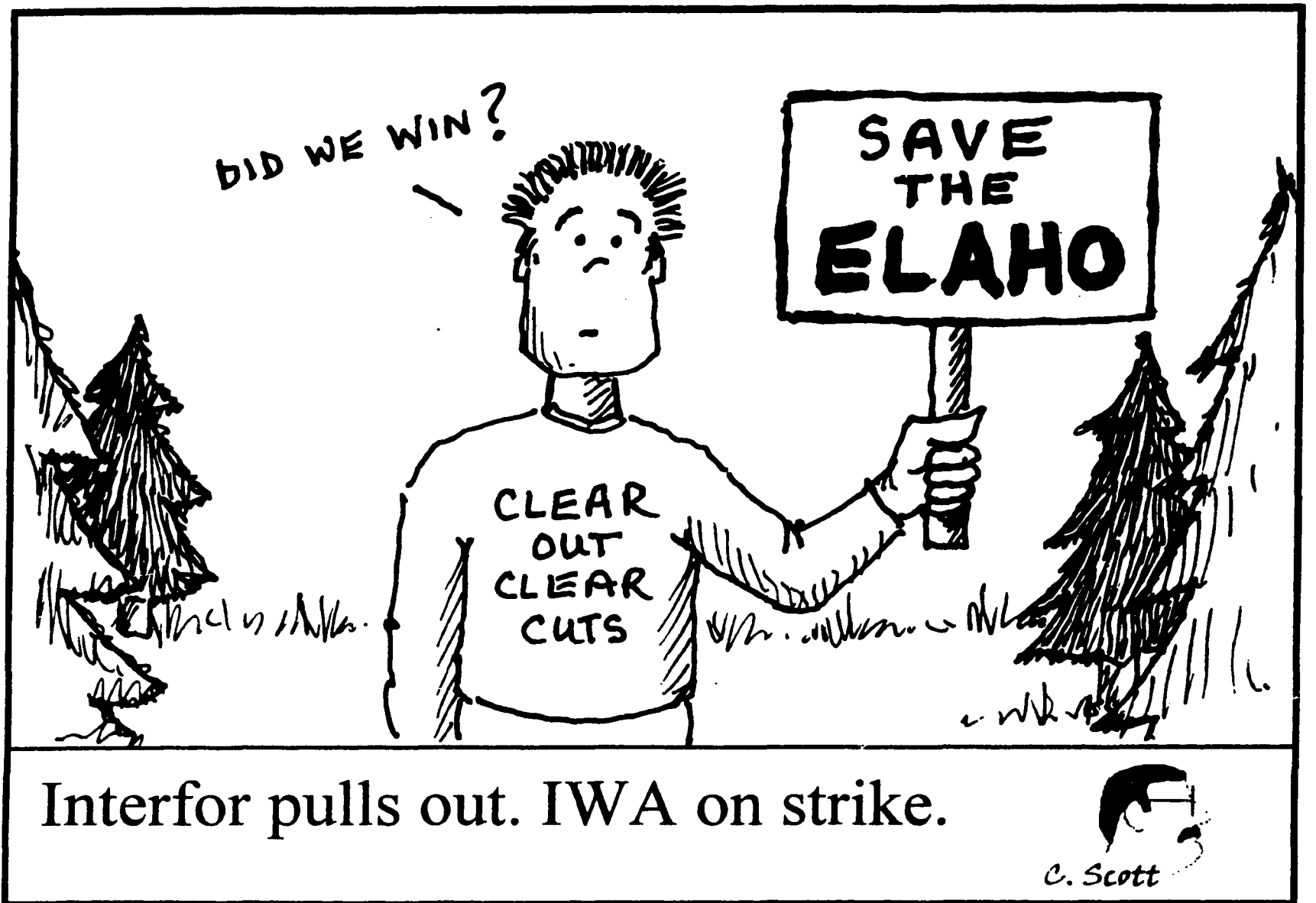
This week we're once again giving over the space where we normally write our editorials and columns to you, the reader — not because we have nothing to say, but because you have so much to say.

Readers speak out on environmental debate

Protester 'dismayed by disrespect' at Squamish rally

Forestry workers I talked to on my trek were educated and respectful, and we agreed on most of the above points. I come from a radically different philosophical perspective on nature, but we share a lot of common ground. Next time, think about that before you walk away or swear at me.





Interfor a 'good corporate citizen', says MP

As most readers know, part of Tree Farm Licence (TFL) 38, which is held by International Forest Products Limited (Interfor), has become a contentious issue in conducting legitimate harvesting operations by that firm in the upper Elaho Valley. Activist groups would like to see much of this area turned into a national park, which they want to call the Stoltmann Wilderness.

In March 1997, People's Action for Threatened Habitat (PATH) began their blockade of Interfor's access to TFL 38. Since that time, protesters have intermittently blocked access to the TFL and have vandalized equipment belonging to Interfor and local logging contractors. Interfor has been required to obtain three different court injunctions to allow its employees and contractors access to their place of legitimate work. These events culminated in confrontations in late summer of

1999. Residents of the Squamish area know only too well, the impact these illegal blockades and confrontations have had on the economy and their peace of mind.

This spring these activist elements have resumed their illegal activities in the region. Some of these protesters have been arrested for illegally blocking logging operations, and several who were arrested received sentences for contempt of court. These arrests have not deterred this illegal activity and at one point one protest group promised that 1,000 of their people would be arrested this summer.

The community of Squamish and Interfor have done everything expected and asked of them, with the exception of closing up shop and firing everyone. I believe people in the area are sick and tired of having their compromises and concessions met by heavy-handed criticism and illegal activities. I believe

Interfor has been a good corporate citizen and has done everything they could to construct some sense of balance in this protracted exercise. In mid-June Interfor even accepted a B.C. Supreme Court ruling that struck down the injunction granted earlier to them. Spokespersons for Interfor felt that the court decision struck a balance, saying the decision sent a message to their employees that confrontation was not acceptable. The President of the company was most magnanimous in his comments about the court decision, saying, "I hope this strong message from the courts serves to force some significant decisions

about the way forests are managed in B.C."

As the Member of Parliament for the area, I don't know what more one could ask from Interfor. They have participated in dialogue with the protesters and government but remain vilified by some. All they are asking for is government to manage public lands on behalf of the people of the province. They are calling on the government to assert that mandate to ensure the people of B.C. do not lose the right to balanced, sound land management decisions. Is there something wrong with that? It is regrettable there has been confrontation but it is unacceptable that the people

of the District of Squamish remain the target of uninformed outsiders and professional activists.

Interestingly, in the fact of all this grief for Interfor and the people of Squamish and area who make a living by forestry, Interfor received the Millennium Business Award for Environmental Achievement. Interfor was one of 12 companies worldwide to receive the award from the United Nations Environment Programme and the International Chamber of Commerce. This is a significant international endorsement of not only the environmental practices of Interfor, but testimony of their good

corporate citizenship. Isn't it ironic, that some out-of-country protesters are allowed to cause such disruption of Interfor's operations, claiming they are not environmentally conscious, yet the United Nations feels otherwise? Isn't it also ironic, I read many full-page stories about the protesters, but very little of any coverage about this UN award.

Enhanced 911 service considered

Council's protective services committee recommended June 27 district staff enter discussions with Telus to initiate enhanced 911 service in Squamish.

The cost would be \$0.23 per residential line, though that rate may drop soon, and \$0.08 per business line, standard rates throughout the province.

Enhanced 911 provides an instant trace on all 911 calls, even immediate hang-ups.

Provincial regulations require the service to be in place by Oct. 1.

"It's in place everywhere but Squamish," Larry Miller, Telus manager of 911 services, said. "We get more calls for emergency traces from Squamish than from the rest of the province combined."

Millennium grant denied

The federal government has turned down Squamish's application for a Canada Millennium Partnership Program grant for the all-weather fields and a lawn bowling facility.

The May 12 letter from the Millennium Bureau of Canada said the proposal was of an infrastructure nature and therefore inadmissible. If approved, the grant could have covered up to half of the project's cost.

Library gets funding

The Squamish Public Library is one of 70 public libraries across the province that received a grant in aid on Friday.

The Ministry of Municipal Affairs shelled out more than \$8.4 million towards the operating costs of B.C.'s 70 public library boards, which operate 227 public library branches. Squamish received \$37,620 which will help cover such things as annual operating costs and buy new books, electronic products and other materials.

"Public libraries provide an invaluable service, whether it's helping children develop the pattern of lifelong learning," said Municipal Affairs Minister Cathy McGregor.

Lighting the community's spirit

A spectacle of unparalleled beauty is ready to light the skies of Squamish on Saturday night.

Now in its second year, the Squamish Lantern Festival is set for July 8 at Alice Lake Provincial Park with the procession around the lake starting at 9:30 p.m.

Organizers are hoping that the visual spectacle will incorporate all the best elements of Squamish: a strong sense of community, cultural diversity, grassroots organization, cooperation and reliance on the creative and homemade.

"The Lantern Festival mandate is to cherish, embrace and celebrate life," said organizer Julie Atkinson-Beckett. "We facilitate this mandate with our community-based celebration. The Squamish Lantern Festival is an incredible event that brings together friends, families and neighbours together to create low-tech magic and pride in togetherness in our community."

Lanterns are created from tissue paper, bamboo sticks and glue and are lit with tea lights.

"The Lantern Festival has been extremely well received by the community thus far," she said. "In addition to the popularity of the scheduled workshops that have taken place so far, several special interest groups are making lanterns together."

Workshops are taking place in the mezzanine of the Brennan Park Recreation Centre on Wednesday and Thursday from 6 to 9 p.m.

There will also be workshops on Thursday and Friday at Alice Lake from 10 a.m. to noon.

Besides the evening procession cookies and hot chocolate will be for sale with all proceeds going to support the Rotary Cares fund-raiser.

"The procession starts at 9:30 p.m. and everyone is encouraged to bring a picnic dinner and spend the evening at the park," said Atkinson-Beckett.

"Although the procession start time is later than most younger children's bedtime, it is an event worth staying up for. Community pride can become intrinsic in our children who will one day become our future."

"I've only lived in Squamish for a short time, but when I read about all the negative stuff about Squamish in the Vancouver Sun, it just makes me want to work harder. Let's all come together and show everyone that Squamish is a great community that celebrates life and community pride."

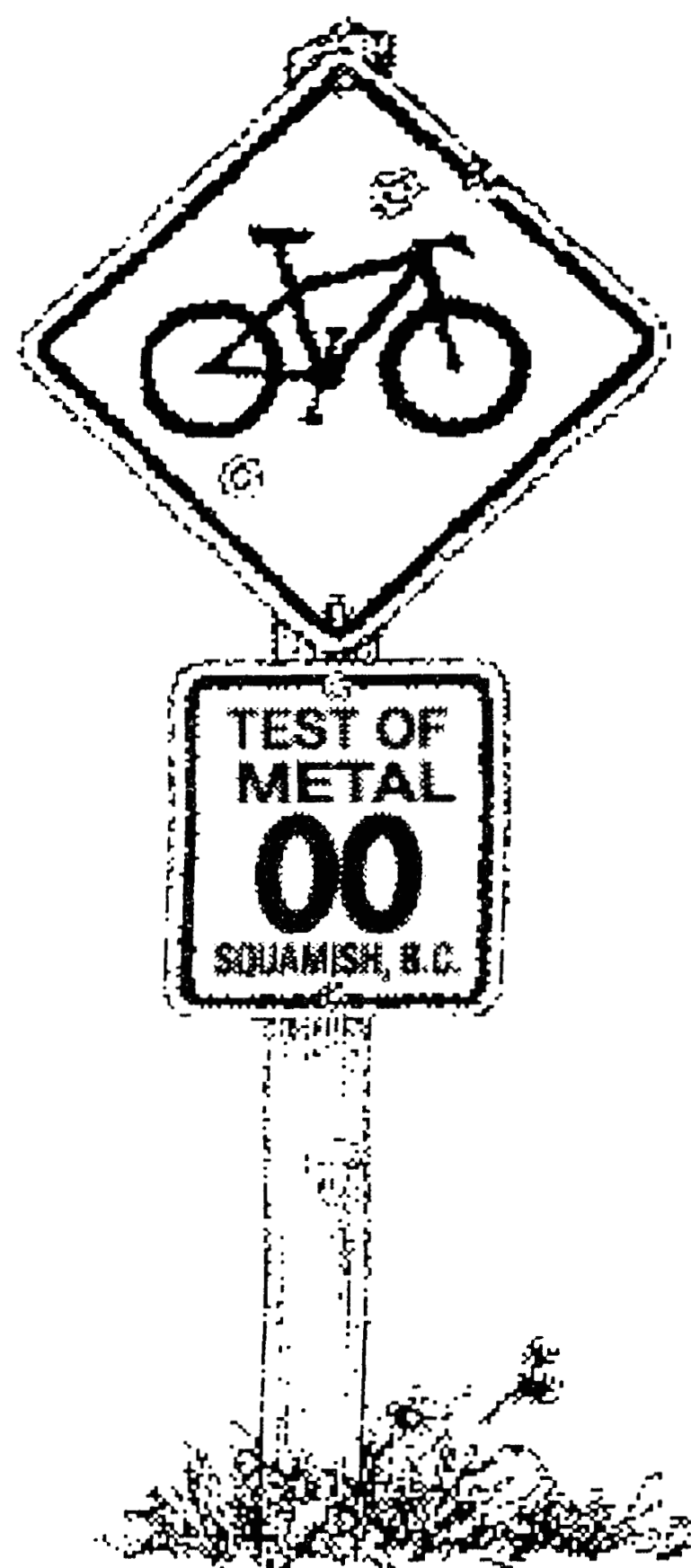

Déjà vu at the finish line

Miles, Bisaro repeat as champions in the Canadian Epic

Great weather, enthusiastic crowds and double repeat winners were among the highlights at the fifth annual Test of Metal mountain bike race on Sunday.

Whistler's Chad Miles is really getting to like Squamish after repeating as the 2000 Test champ.

Miles came across the line in a time of 2:37:24 — a little over five minutes faster than his win last year.

Miles said he lost sight of the race pack at Rock 'n' Roll Hill, which is just about 40 minutes into the race and it was clear sailing to the finish line.

"I don't think there was anything that was going to stop me this year, other than

mechanical, or error on the course," Miles said. "I really wanted it this year. Last year was a win, but it wasn't a convincing win. There was a bit of controversy last year and I wanted to win convincingly."

And convince he did, picking up all 10 primes along the way.

A prime is a special \$100 prize for the first man or woman across that point.

"I'm sure I'll have no trouble spending that thousand bucks," Miles said. "One of my aims was to win all the primes and I'm glad I saved enough for the end. The course was exactly the same this year and the rain that we had was just enough to firm it up and make it faster."

"I'm really happy with my time and look-out — next year it's time to think three-peat."

Finishing second this year was Hovey Carter in a time of 2:46:20, while Lucas Curran finished third in a time of 2:48:41.

On the women's side, Courtney's

Kiara Bisaro captured her second straight Test of Metal title as she came across the line in a time of 3:15:55.

Bisaro was surprised to find out that she won as Claire Townsend looked to be in full command of the race as she won seven straight primes.

But somewhere along the last part of the course, Townsend blew a tire and came across the line eventually with a flat.

"I have no idea what happened to Claire, I must have passed her," a surprised, yet happy Bisaro said following the race.

"This course and this race is totally made by the people. It's so fun, there are so many people out there cheering — you just want to race so hard."

Bisaro said the course was great this year, but added that the wet and muddy conditions made it a little harder. "I think I'm in a little better shape technically this year so that probably helped a bit," she said.

Finishing second was Linda Robichaud in a time of 3:21:35 followed by Townsend at 3:33:10.

Both riders are from Victoria.

From the local perspective, Team Corsa's Dave Heisler was the first Squamish rider across the line.

Heisler clocked in at a time of 3:20:00, good for 13th overall.

"It was really hard and really fun," Heisler said. "It was muddy and raining at the top of Mamquam, but overall the race has awesome organization and it was just a wicked day."

His finish time for was especially satisfying for the veteran rider.

"Coming back from a knee injury last year I could barely walk," he said. "It's really satisfying to get in the top 20."

Everybody that I've talked to is just raving about the whole race.

For the first time in five years, I got on a motorcycle and rode the course.

"The race just went great and we can't wait until next year."

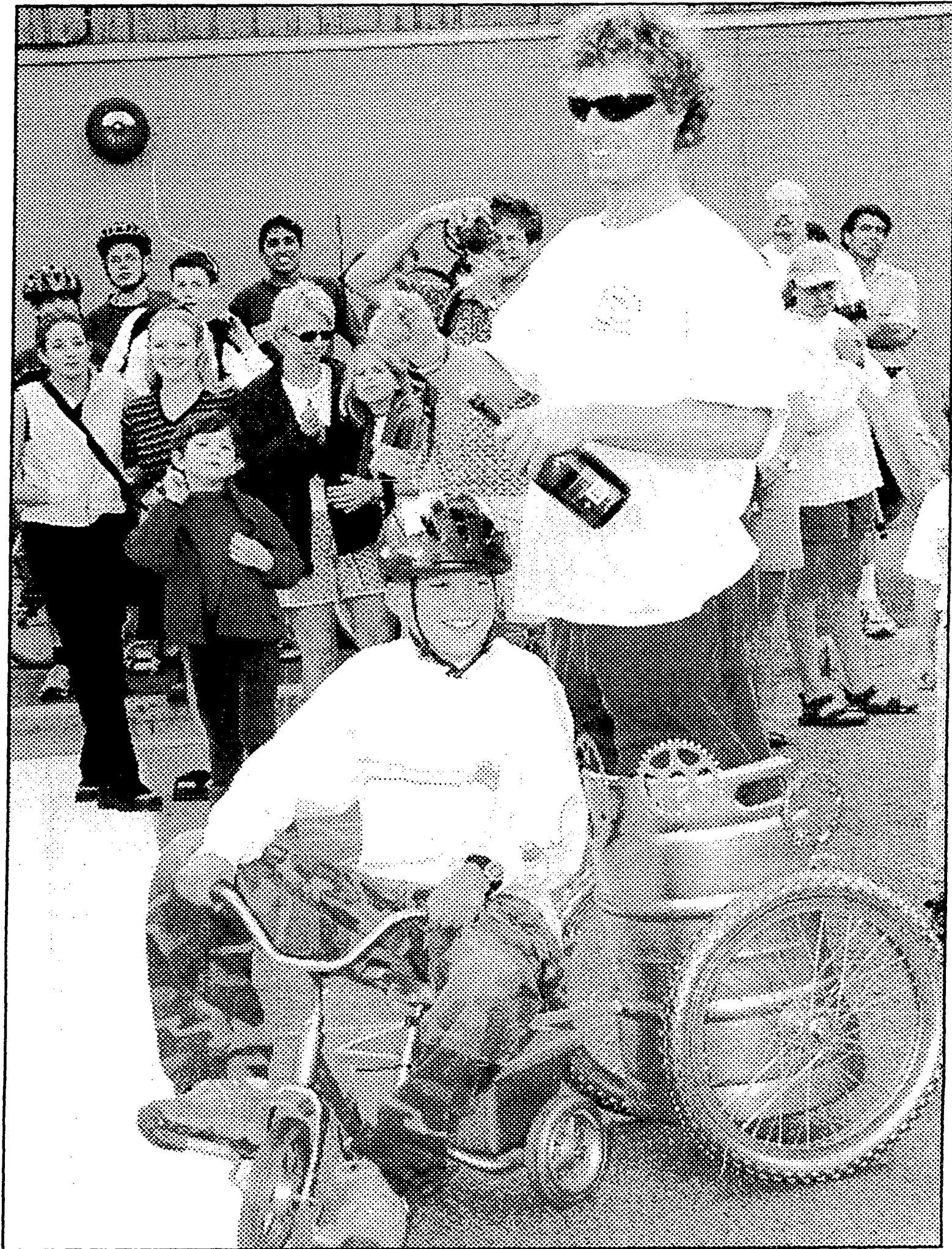

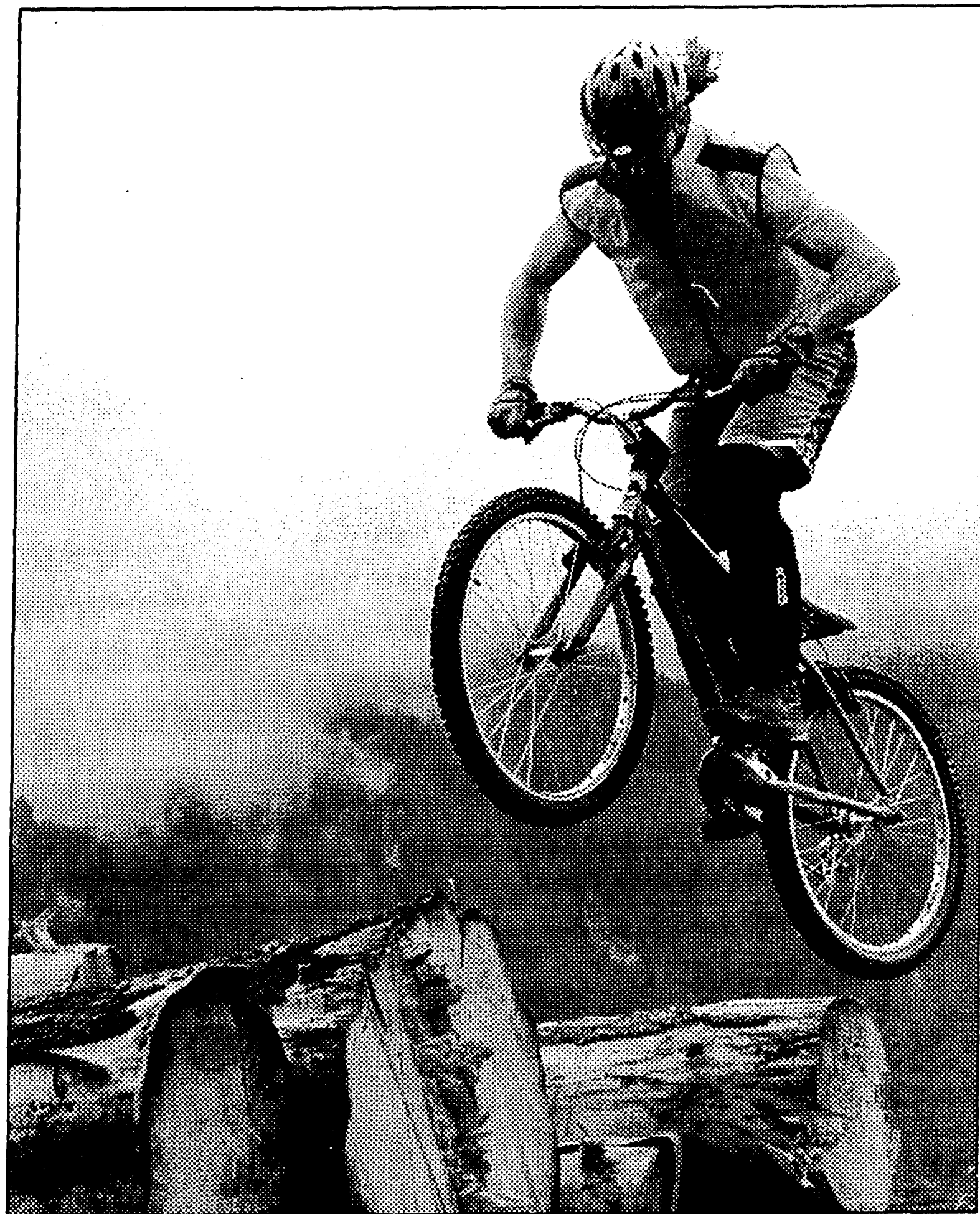

Pirates attack the Barracudas in Burnaby

The Squamish Pirates took part in their second swim meet of the season last weekend in Burnaby, coming away with 20 best times out of 38 swims.

Squamish was one of 15 teams who competed in the Burnaby Barracudas Swim Meet June 24 and 25.

The Division 1 girls relay team 'Pirate Pretties' consisting of Alison MacKellar, Claire Ourom, Marni Jarvis and Theresa Erickson came in second in the medley relay while the Division 3 boys relay team of Linden Drygas,

Jordan Mulholland, Daniel MacKellar and Thomas MacKellar came in eighth.

Lisa Davies swam the 50 metre freestyle for the first time in 49.6 seconds and also came in first in the Level B 100m backstroke.

Linden swam the 50m freestyle in 34.8 seconds and the 50m fly in 46.18 seconds while Daniel now has best times of 38.42 seconds in the 50m freestyle and 48.2 seconds in the 50m fly.

Philip MacKellar achieved 34.96 seconds in the 50m freestyle; 3:04.83 in the 200m individual medley and swam the 100m fly for the first time in 1:23.42.

Thomas also swam well, finishing 16th in the 50m freestyle.

Jordan achieved best times in all swims Saturday.

As part of the medley relay team, he swam the 50m fly in just under 48 seconds.

His best time in the 50m freestyle is now 37.61 seconds and he reduced his 100m individual medley time by 4.6 seconds to 1:43.40.

Jordan swam the 50m backstroke in 50.5 seconds and he completed things with a 100m freestyle swim in a time of 1:23.26.

Amy O'Brien improved by 4.5 seconds in the 50m freestyle and 1.1 seconds in

the 50m backstroke while Claire swam the 100m freestyle for the first time in 1:48.9.

Claire took 3.31 seconds off her 50m backstroke with a time of 50.69 and 18.6 seconds came off her 50m breaststroke time.

Shawna Erickson had a best time of 37.62 seconds in the 50m freestyle and she also swam the 200m individual medley in 3:42.89.

Theresa took 6.9 seconds off of her 50m freestyle by swimming it in 51.8 seconds and she took 19.9 seconds off of her 50m fly time.

Melissa Fowler improved by 3.7 seconds in the 50m

freestyle with a time of 32.7 seconds and she took 1.8 seconds off of her 100m individual medley.

Marni swam the 50m backstroke in 57.2 seconds while taking a whopping 26.39 seconds off her previous best time in the 50m breaststroke by swimming it in 1:11.11.

Finally, Alison, who seems to be headed to the provincials this year, swam the 50m freestyle in 46.2 seconds which is 2.5 seconds faster than last meet.

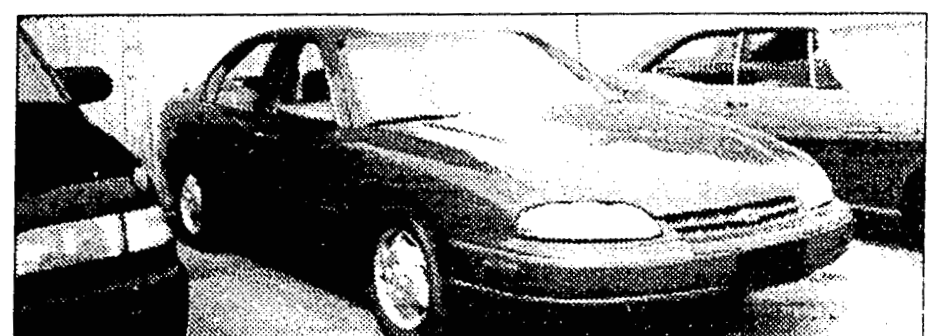
Her 50m fly time of 54.6 seconds is 5.6 seconds better and a time of 1:56.6 in the 100m individual medley is a 3.3 second reduction.

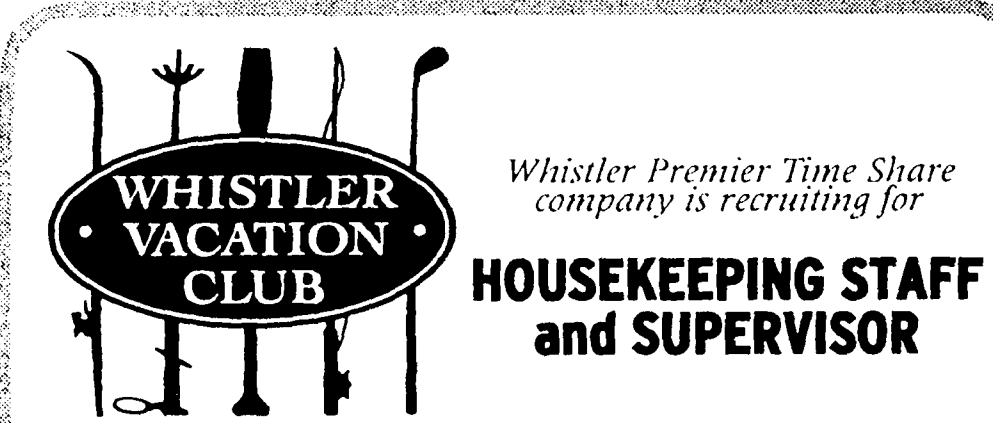

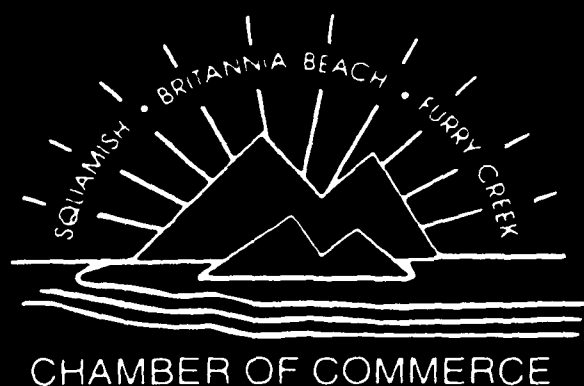

show passengers what to expect when the stream train rolls into Squamish. Thanks especially to Jane Iverson and Chrys Smith for helping to coordinate the projects.

We scored a hat trick!

For the third straight time, the Squamish Visitor Info Centre (VIC) has scored over 90% in a Tourism B.C. Quality Service Evaluation. This year the VIC received a score of 95%.

Each summer, Tourism B.C. conducts a Quality Service Evaluation. The 113 Visitor Information Centres in BC are "shopped" twice between May and September by a mystery visitor. The visitor evaluates everything from the accessibility of the building, to the quality and nature of the service provided. VIC's can receive a maximum score of 175 points.

In 1999 the Visitor Info Centre received a 99% rating, followed by 93% later that year. Squamish was recognized by Tourism BC as one of only six centres in BC to score an average of 98.5% for an evaluation.

The Chamber of Commerce has a contract with the District of Squamish, under a fee for service agreement, to run the Visitor Information Centre. The office is open during the summer with hours from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., seven days a week. Stop by and find out what tourism activities are available in our community.

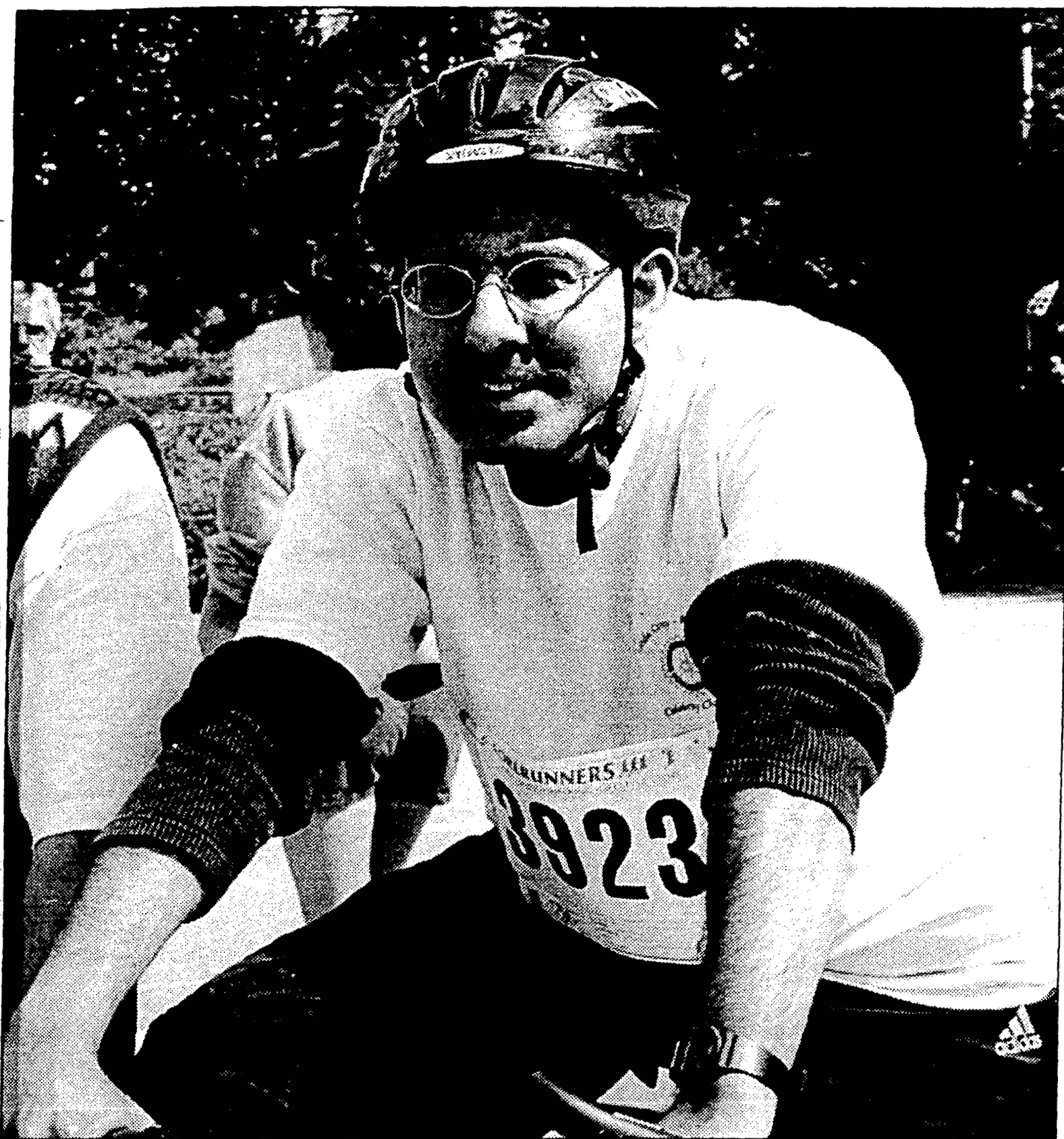

What the travelling public thinks of Squamish

BCIT Survey Results

The Chamber of Commerce partnered with the British Columbia Institute of Technology as part of the students Directed Studies, Marketing Research project. We had three students: Vanessa Bailey, Haley Kennedy and Vicki Bains assist the Chamber with a drop box survey. The purpose was to discover what the travelling public think of Squamish, what they are aware of and what improvements or changes they would like to see.

Some of the results include:

The number one reason why people stop in Squamish is for a rest stop, and that the average length of stay is between one hour and five hours.

The top three tourist attractions that people were aware of were:

1. Shannon Falls

2. Eagle Viewing
3. BC Museum of Mining

The majority of the visitors indicated that they were either "satisfied" or "very satisfied" with their time in Squamish, with hardly any people answering that they were unsatisfied.

A large number of people said that "yes" they would like to have more information on the tourist attractions in Squamish. (Which is good as it means that people are receptive to efforts made to increase advertising and awareness of things to do in Squamish.)

When asked to rate how important various things were to them in Squamish, the top three responses were: Restaurants, tied for #2. Gas stations and Tourist Information Signs, and finally Fast Food Outlets. (Indicating that people surveyed were looking for Squamish to be a place to make a rest stop, not as a tourist destination.)

The top three areas that the people stopping in Squamish were from were:

1. Vancouver/Lower Mainland
2. USA
3. Other areas in BC

The majority of the respondents were between the ages of 20-49 years, and there were almost exactly the same number of men and women that answered the survey

Suggestions for the best method of letting the travelling public know about Squamish and what it has to offer:

- Improve signage
- Improve the Squamish Internet site, and make it easier to access
- More ads in the BC Lower Mainland and Washington areas
- Distribute brochures
- Hold more special events

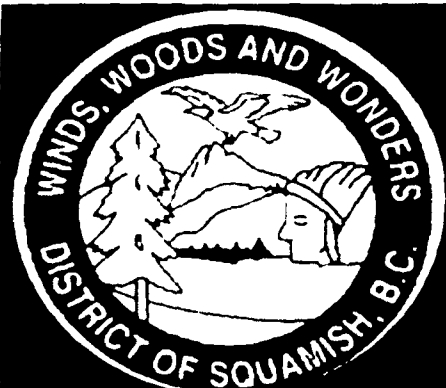
