Sparks fly in council

Kahlon, Smith vote against G.B.A. rezoning

High emotion was evident among councillors as the wood chip handling facility on Catermole Slough passed its first hurdle to a rezoning on a 5-2 vote Dec. 19.

The anticipated council split materialized during the two-hour debate over G.B.A. Logging Ltd.'s application, with councillors Raj Kahlon and Shelley Smith opposing both the rezoning and an accompanying amendment to the Official Community Plan.

G.B.A. president Greg Richmond and consultant Lawrence Berelowitz of Urban Forum Associates presented the proposed facility, highlighting the area's industrial designation under the OCP, the measures taken to conceal it from the downtown and methods to avoid airborne dust and wood chips.

Berelowitz emphasized the facility will generate at most two trains a day when it eventually goes to two shifts. He also stated the train would replace 20-25 logging trucks that serviced the dry land log port the chip facility replaces. He did not mention G.B.A. cannot re-establish their log port, which as a grandfathered use not pursued for more than six months is no longer legal in the light industrial property.

"Any further delay would be unfair and unjust," said Berelowitz. One of the major focuses of the debate, both by the proponents and council, was a possible alternate location.

Richmond once again denied any land on the Nexxon (the renamed Canadian Occidental Petroleum) site is available, citing the mercury contamination and restrictive leases.

"We have gone too far down the path on our site ... to be knocked back and have another maybe," Richmond said. "The path we are on is heading to a win-lose," said Smith. She noted consultants Nexxon hired to help develop the six to eight hectares of usable land have contacted councillors.

"We must be willing to look objectively at alternatives and fortunately there is one," she said.

Suggesting an in-depth economic impact study is needed, Smith pointed out a number of nearby properties are designated for mixed use under the

OCP.

"How can we rezone land without considering the effect it will have on neighbouring lands?"

Among the motions passed 5-2 was relaxation of the OCP guidelines for the area.

If adopted, the OCP will no longer require exterior lighting be non-intrusive, outdoor equipment, garbage and fencing screened from surrounding residential properties or landscaping provided.

Instead, developers "should" follow such guidelines, instead of "must" and "shall."

The rezoning will amend the site's light industrial zoning to allow a chip facility; all Lower Mainland municipalities put such operations in heavy or general industrial zones.

"I say we are going from light industry to heavy industry and disguising it with

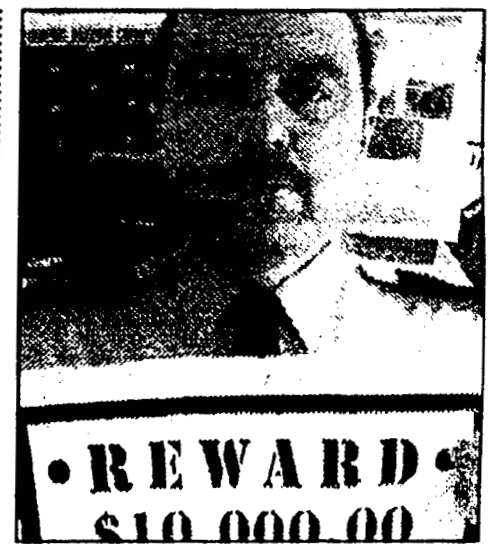

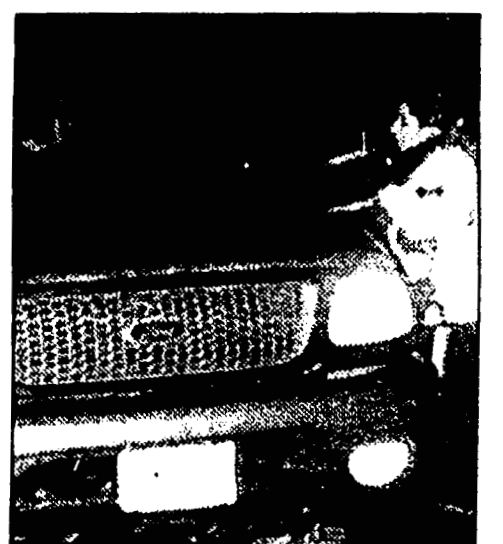

The McIntosh Murder: Year 3

Still waiting for justice

Without crucial witnesses, McIntosh murder investigation remains at an impasse

The poster is wrinkled, not quite yellowing, but still starting to show its age.

Sgt. Gary Brine takes it off the wall at the Squamish RCMP detachment, smooths it out and holds it up to the camera.

"I wasn't sure we still had one," he says.

There aren't many of the posters around anymore: a year ago they were on bulletin boards and in shop windows all over Squamish.

The \$10,000 private reward leading to an arrest and conviction in the Dec. 31, 1997 murder of local lawyer and triathlete Bob McIntosh has gone unclaimed since it was offered in 1998.

The money hasn't been incentive enough to bring forward the truth. Nor have repeated appeals from the police and members of the community.

The question remains: what will it take to bring the killer or killers of Bob McIntosh to justice?

The information is out there. Approximately 100 people were in the Highlands home of Dr. Richard Cudmore

when McIntosh and two friends went over to check on the party at their honeymooning neighbour's house.

The three were separated in the house, and McIntosh was knocked unconscious. He died of multiple blows to the head — some of which may have been delivered while McIntosh was on the ground and defenceless, according to an autopsy.

Police arrested a Squamish man, Ryan McMillan, early

in their information. "We know we have been lied to by some people," said Cpl. Hugh Winter in May 1998.

That lack of information led Crown counsel to stay charges against McMillan in September of that year.

And the police investigation has essentially stalled at that point, with no new information or charges since.

"At this point we think we have exhausted all the areas we can look at," Brine said.

The investigation itself has dwindled — from 10 officers from Squamish and the Lower Mainland to just one

in the investigation. But even after conducting more than 100 interviews and receiving some 261 tips in the case, they knew there were serious gaps

man, Cpl. Winter — and his time has been occupied by investigations of other high-profile murder cases, such as the January 1999 murder of Vancouver man Michael Raymond Bath (charges were laid in May of this year against two Nova Scotia men but later stayed) and the February 2000 murder of Vancouver's Rishi Kant Singh — both of whose bodies were found in Squamish.

Winter also spent much of this year preparing for the trial of Squamish resident Byron Blue, who in October was convicted of the 1964 murder of 12-year-old Judy Howey.

The resolution of that long-standing unsolved murder brought more public attention to the McIntosh case.

Some even hoped that the notoriety surrounding Blue's trial and conviction would be

enough to convince somebody to break the silence.

But the new notoriety brought no new tips in the McIntosh case to light, according to Brine.

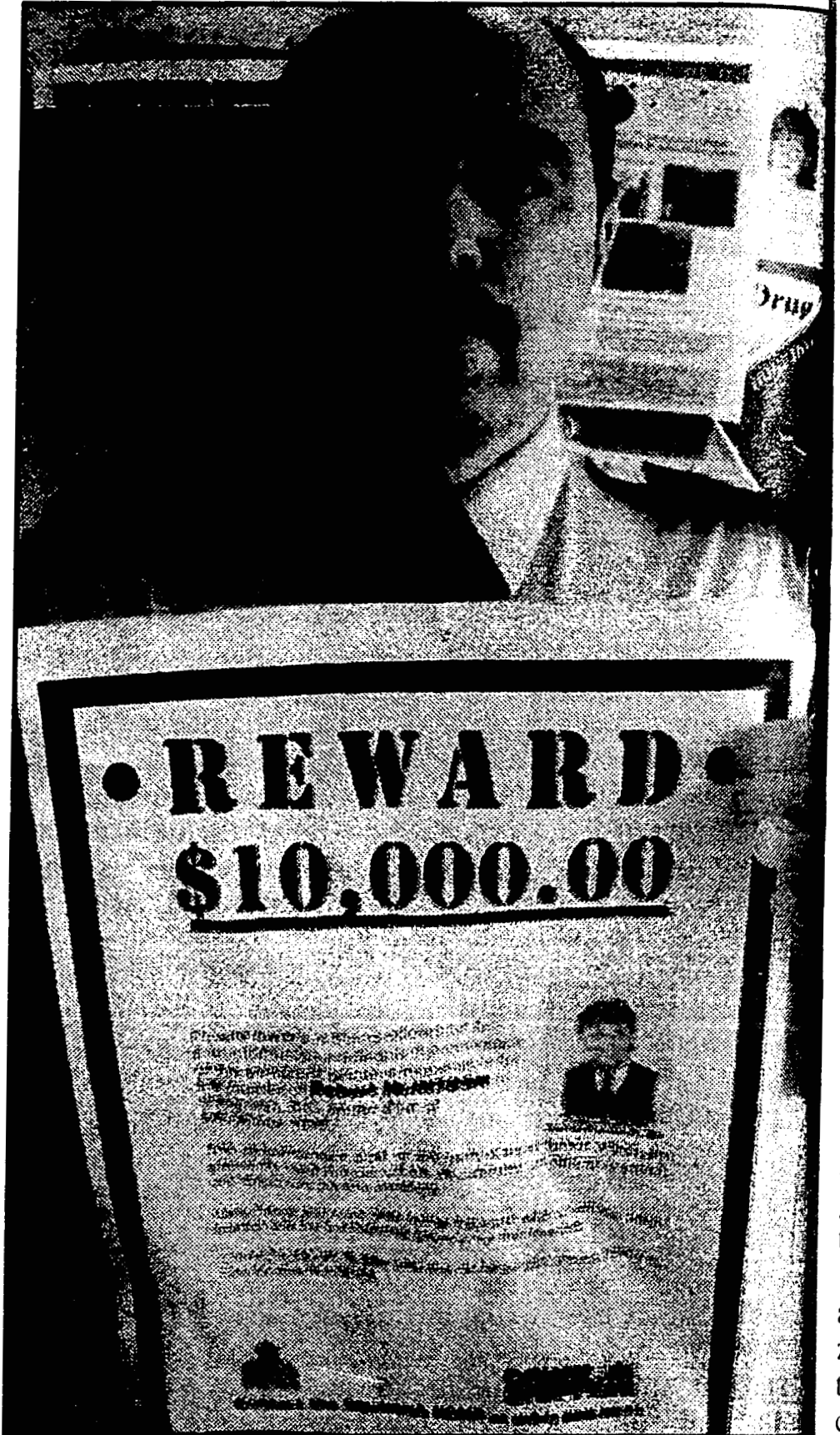
The lack of emphasis on the McIntosh case isn't due to lack of police interest, he says.

"It's certainly very important to the community and seen as an important case to our detachment.

"If that crucial piece of information comes in, if that crucial witness comes forward, then we can devote more resources. That may be some time, or it may be tomorrow.

"I believe that some day somebody's conscience will awaken. I really believe that people will mature and as their lives change it may cause them to come forward."

But right now, all the police



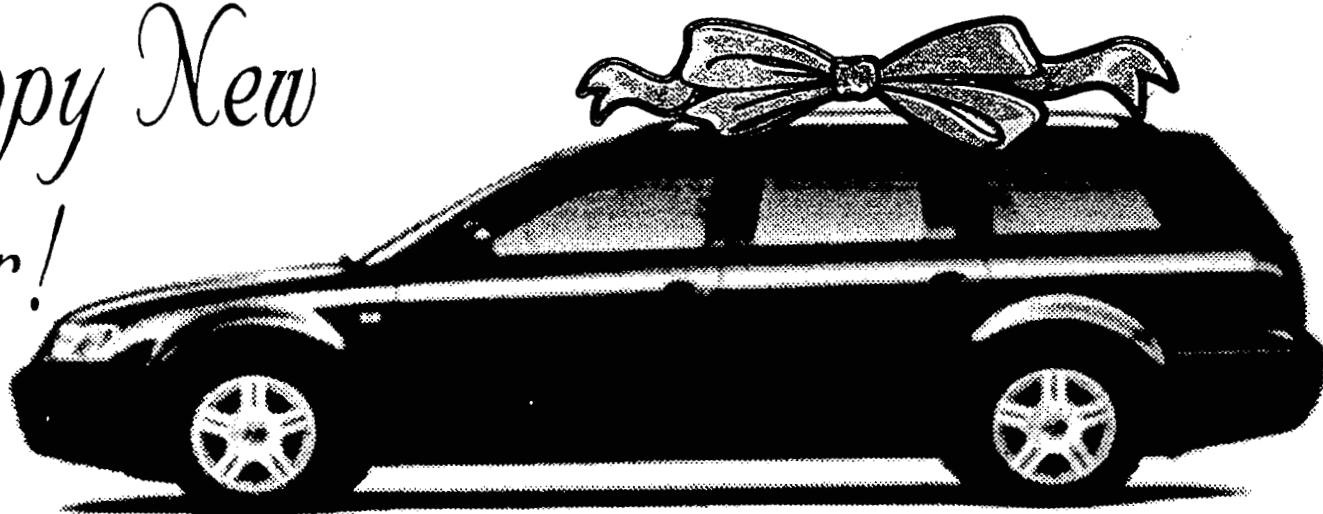

Police on the Counter Attack

Santa Claus will have his elves out in full force this holiday season — only these elves won't be handing out presents, they'll be handing out tickets.

ICBC Counter Attack road checks are in full swing along Hwy. 99 and the Squamish RCMP are on the lookout for erratic drivers and those who have had a little too much to drink.

"Erratic driving doesn't necessarily mean drinking and driving, but it's an indication that something is wrong and we need to get that person off the road to make the highway safer for everyone," said Cpl. Joe Schofield.

"It doesn't take many glasses of beer to put you over the legal limit. When you have a number of pubs and drinking establishments in a community like Squamish where people visit one outside their neighbourhood, everyone has to get home and that's when people have to make the right choices about how their getting home."

In results released by the RCMP, Squamish has seen 15,490 vehicles pass through roadchecks from the beginning of the year to Nov. 30.

Police gave 51 drivers roadside screenings, 12 standard field sobriety tests, laid three impaired driving charges, two administrative driving prohibitions, 35 24-hour driving suspensions and 82 violation tickets.

Police have also seized illegal drugs in six cases, a number of items of stolen property and have laid eight other charges.

By comparison, there were 31,429 vehicles checked through roadchecks in Whistler, 128 roadside screenings, 12 standard field sobriety tests, 68 24-hour suspensions, and 169 violation tickets handed out.

There were also drugs seized

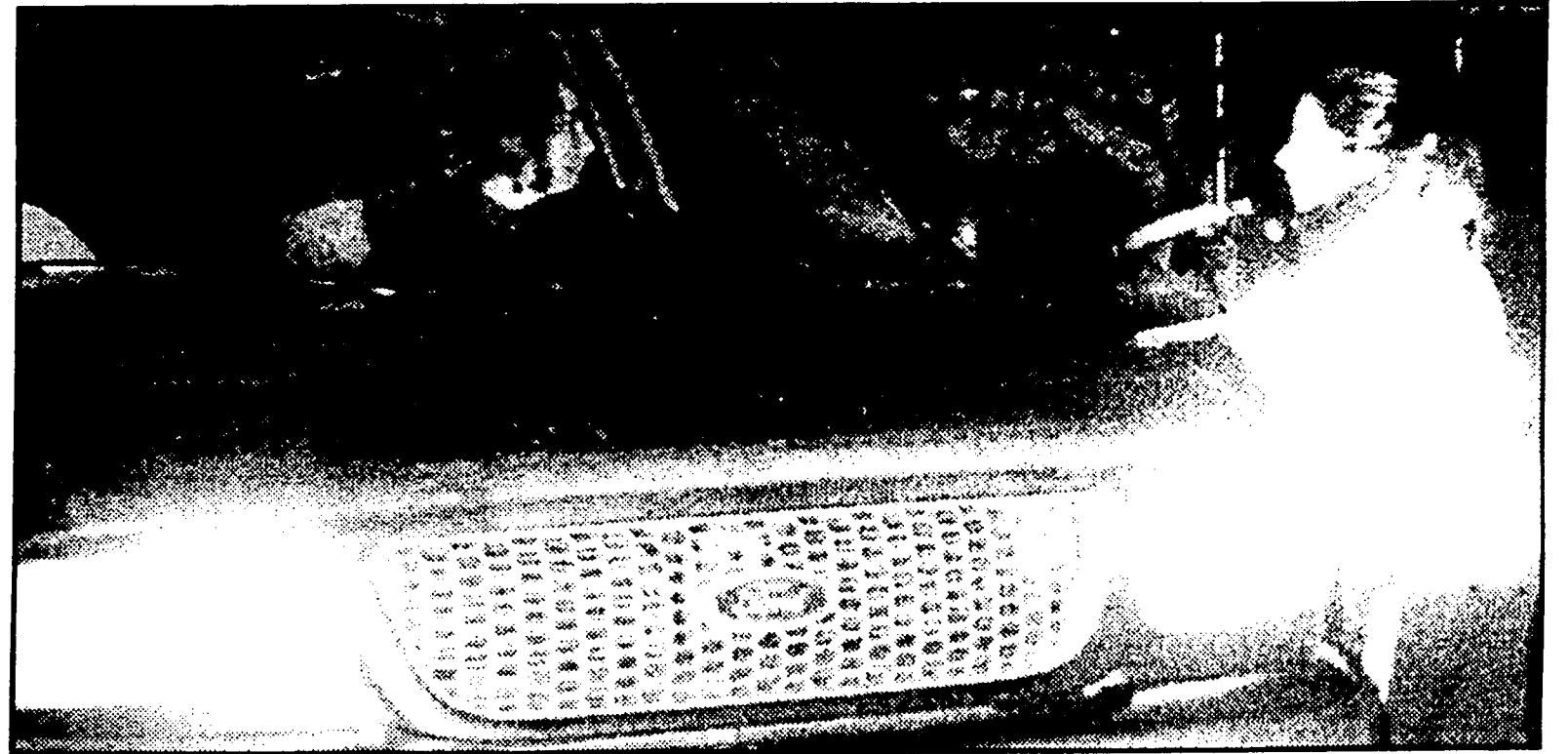
in 62 cases and 37 other charges handed out.

A complete breakdown of the holiday Counter Attack numbers won't be released by ICBC until early in the new year.

The December holiday Counter Attack roadchecks began in 1977. Since then, more than 30 million vehicles have encountered police roadchecks in B.C.

In 1999, five and a half million vehicles were checked resulting in about 900 impaired driving charges and more than 12,000 roadside suspensions.

The Squamish detachment is involved in the ICBC Counter

Attack programs and do a number of spot checks and patrols on a regular basis on Hwy. 99 throughout the year, but at Christmas time they pay special, close attention.

If you are planning to party

this holiday season plan ahead before you go out by either taking a cab, choosing a designated driver or taking Squamish Transit, which is free on New Year's Eve from 7 p.m. until 3:30 a.m.

"An informed choice and planning ahead could mean the difference in avoiding an accident," Schofield said.

This year's Christmas CounterAttack campaign runs until Jan. 3.

Hwy. 99 claims three more lives

Hwy. 99 claimed three more lives last week in a pair of accidents.

Early Friday morning, Dec. 22, Squamish RCMP and emergency crews responded to a head-on collision between a pair of pickup trucks near Porteau Cove Provincial Park, 25 kms south of Squamish.

According to police, the male drivers of both pickups were pronounced dead at the scene.

The male passenger, and only other person involved, from one of the vehicles was airlifted from the scene and taken to a hospital in Vancouver, said Sgt. Gary Brine.

The extent of his injuries are believed to be non-life threatening.

Both vehicles were extensively damaged and one vehicle came to rest partially on the BC Rail track beside the highway.

Names of the deceased were not released as next of kin had not been notified as of press time.

Squamish RCMP are investigating a bizarre hit and run accident that killed a 40-year-old man on Dec. 18.

Just before 6 p.m. police received calls of a man attempting to jump towards, or touch vehicles travelling in the northbound lane of Hwy. 99 just south of Valley Drive.

As police made their way to the scene, they received another call of a pedestrian who had been struck on the highway.

According to police, the victim was struck by two vehicles as he lay on the ground, but a third vehicle is suspected of hitting the man first and then leaving the scene.

"We still feel we're missing some information," said Cpl. Mike Byrne.

Pieces of a black plastic right hand, passenger-side mirror thought to be from a 1998 to 2000 Chevrolet Tahoe or a 1998-2000 GM Yukon, possibly a Denali or

Escalade model, were recovered by police at the scene.

The victim, believed to be a transient, has not been identified by police as he was carrying no identification.

He was described as caucasian, 5'8" tall, about 155 pounds with short brown hair, brown eyes, brown moustache, a one-day beard growth and no scars, tattoos or distinguishing marks.

He was wearing a green and blue Rugged Terrain nylon jacket, black Brooks nylon pants, a purple t-shirt with a white logo Summer League over a basketball and net, blue socks, white Nike Air Zoom runners with a red stripe and green plastic sunglasses.

Police are asking witnesses in both accidents to come forward with information.

Ministry reviews TFL 38; input sought

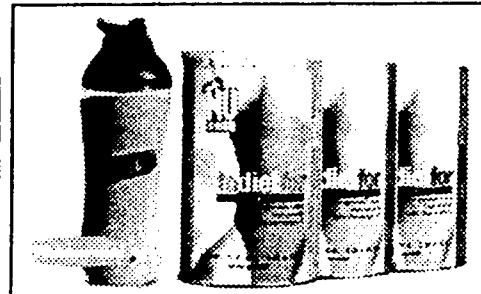

The Ministry of Forests has offered to replace International Forest Products Ltd.'s Tree Farm Licence 38 — with TFL 38. The ministry is now seeking public comment before it reviews Interfor's tenure. "Every five years you review their performance, and if they're performing you renew the licence," said Paul Kuster, the Squamish Forest District manager. TFL 38 has a 25-year tenure; if the government decided to revoke the licence after a review, Interfor would have the remaining 20 years to phase out its operations in the area. If the government decides to offer to renew the licence, as it has done, Interfor's tenure goes back to 25 years. 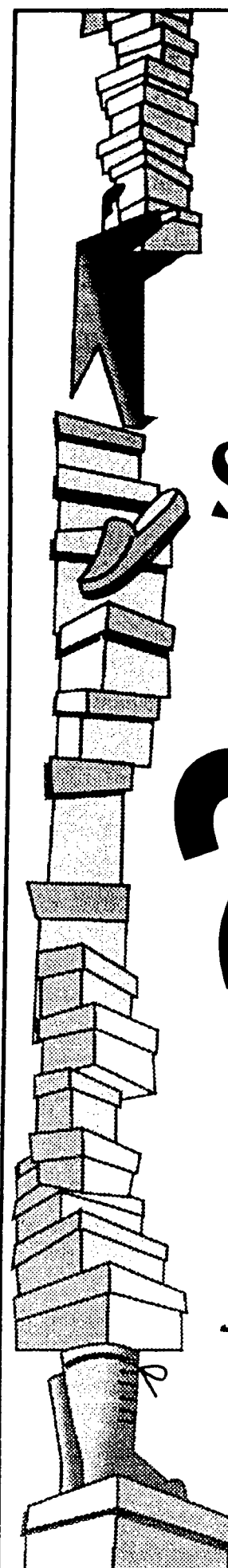

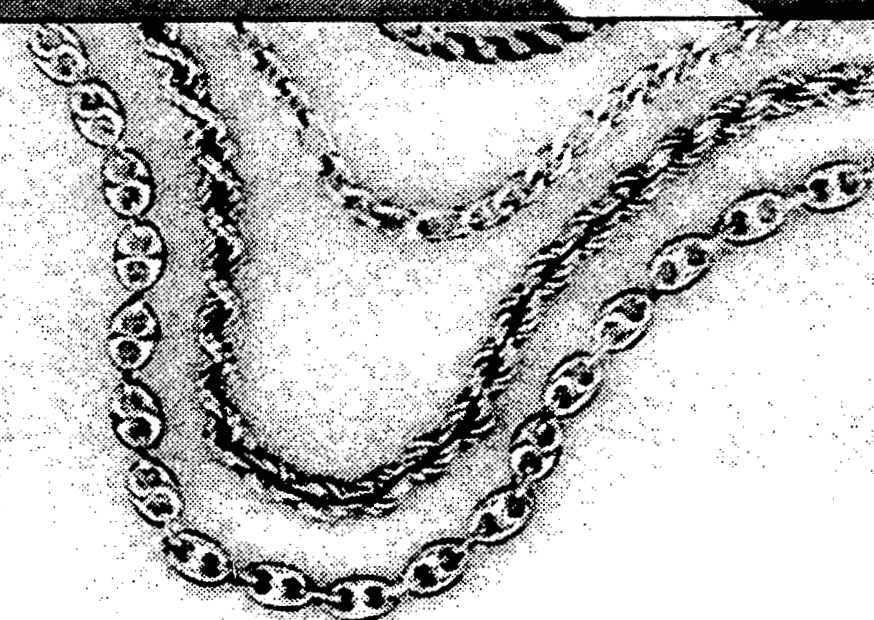

They're back — by the thousands

Every year, tens of thousands of spawning salmon draw thousands of bald eagles to the banks of rivers, streams and creeks in the Squamish Valley between November and February.

Squamish is home to one of the largest yearly gatherings of the gigantic raptors in the world, and holds the world record for most eagles counted — set on Jan. 9, 1994, with a scientific count of 3,769 eagles.

In 1999, a count recorded 2,607 eagles gathered, the second highest number in the 14 years the count has been held.

Yet this count, of necessity, is restricted to a relatively small portion of the Squamish Valley and associated river valleys.

However, the greatest concentration of eagles tends to be within 30 kilometres of the head of Howe Sound.

To find the eagles, one simply has to follow one's nose — dead salmon bear a distinct odour eagles find quite attractive.

The large numbers of salmon, many of whom strand themselves on sand bars or river banks, offer substantial nutrition without requiring great effort.

To keep warm during the bone-chilling winter nights, the eagles need to stuff themselves without using excess energy.

Generally they feed in the early morning, then spend the day in the trees along the river bank.

At night, they move deeper into the forest cover.

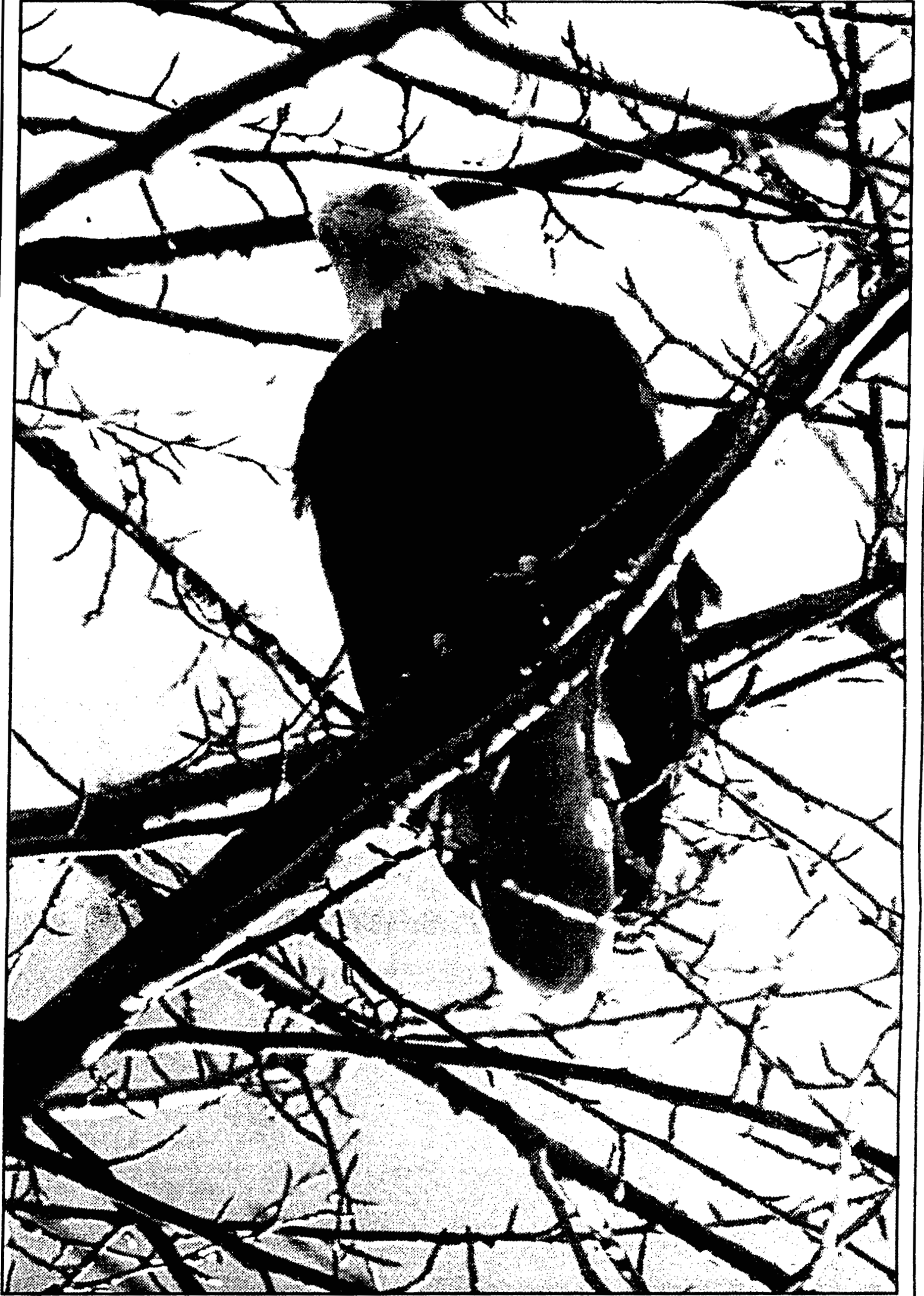
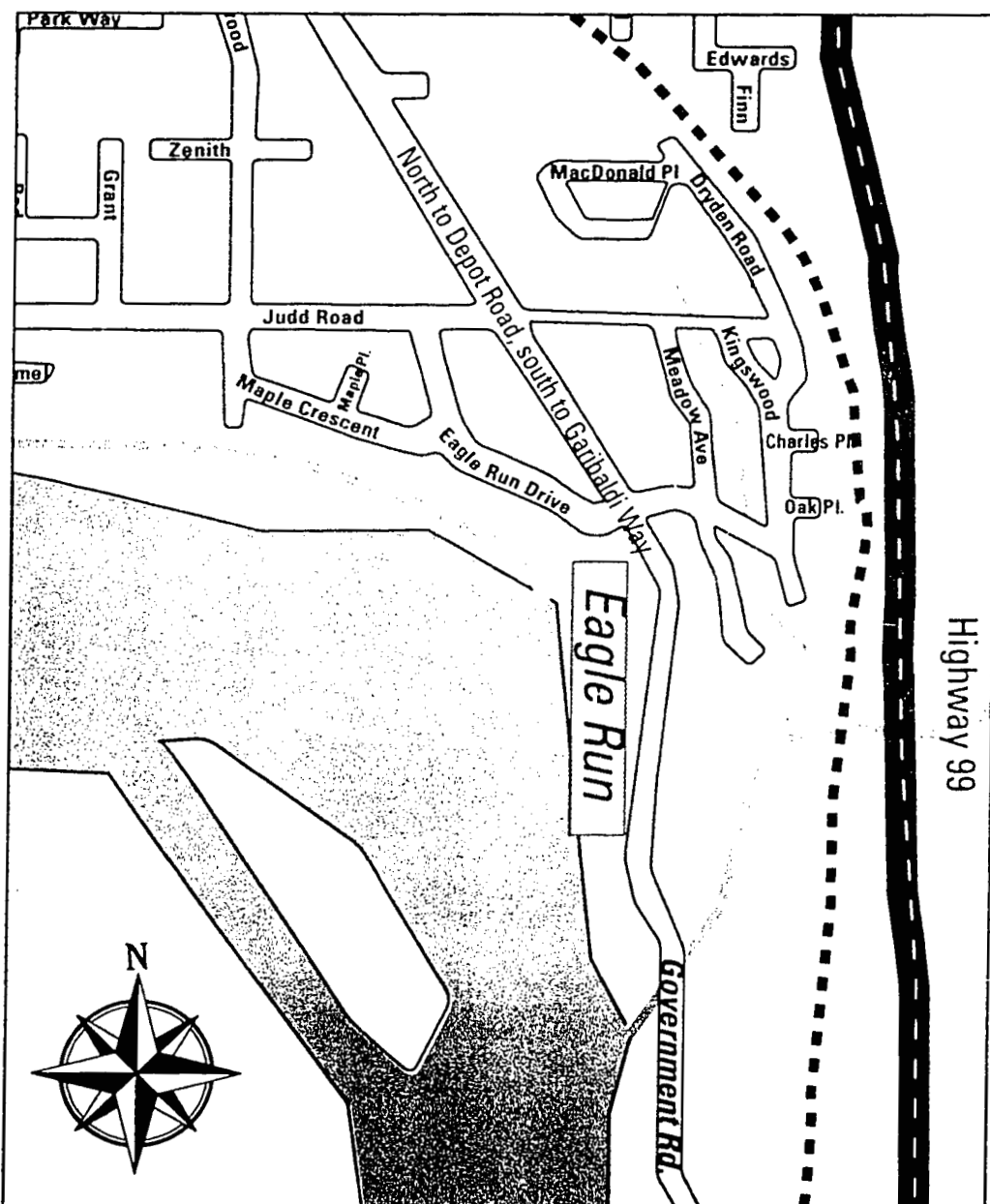

The year in briefs

January-April

UBC's vice-president of external affairs, Peter Ulford, resigned to take on the status of project leader for Squamish's private university project Jan. 3.

An eight-day lockout of BCRail workers ended Jan. 4 after a 10-hour bargaining session mediated by the Labour Relations Board.

A snow-covered runway led to the second plane crash in Squamish in six months.

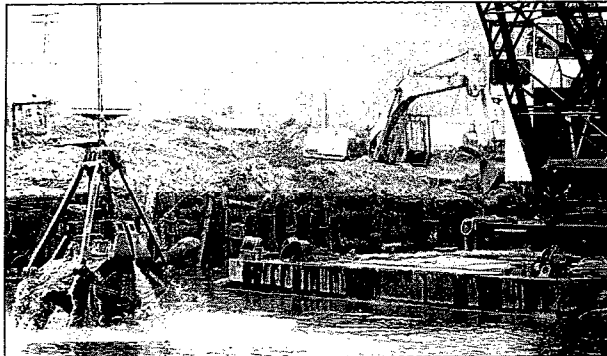
The Cessna 172 dipped onto its roof on landing, yet the pilot and passenger walked away unharmed.

Regular flights between Vancouver and the Squamish airport began Feb. 7 when Whistler Air Service Ltd. debuted winter service.

Five Squamish men were charged with assault, mischief and uttering threats in relation to the destruction of a protest camp in the upper Elaho Valley Sept. 15, 1999 by a group of loggers.

Alice Lake Provincial Park was the scene to a murder investigation after the body of 20-year-old Rishi Kant Singh of Vancouver was found Feb. 17.

Chief Joe Mathias of the Squamish Nation, aged 56, died

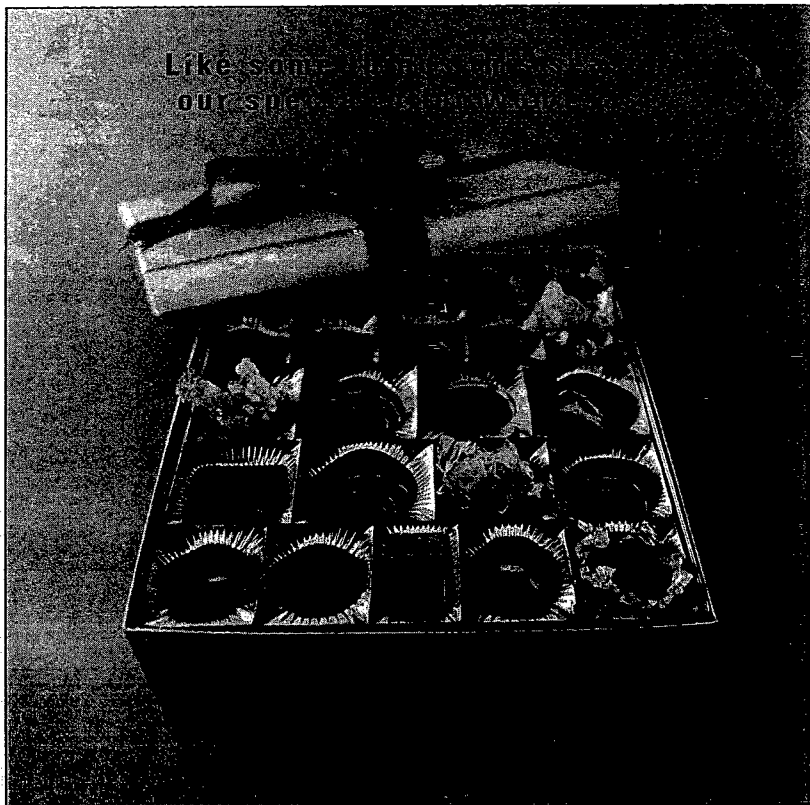

Year in Review

The year in briefs

May-August

School trustees voted to retain junior-senior high school system in Squamish, citing insufficient enrollment levels.

As a result, BSS remained a late 8-10 school, with all students graduating from SS, despite renovations to raise its capacity to 600.

Council split 4-3 on May 2 in approving a development permit for a controversial wood handling facility on the Hermole Slough.

The district and lobby group fight for a Healthy, Active and Prosperous Squamish (CHIPS) had differing opinions on whether the industrial zoning was correct. CHIPS filed suit May 31.

Residential taxes went up six percent as council cut commercial and industrial rates from the end to the low end on the municipal scale.

Joe Tatlow's house in Rose went up in smoke as local provincial agencies simulated an emergency situation to MacDonald Detweiler's 24-hour Emergency Management via Satellite (EMSAT) system.

Nearly 800 people came out for a Celebration of Life for Linda Carney, who died five days earlier at Shoreside Estates and Golf in Kamloops when a tree on the golf cart she was driving

Three men, including a Squamish resident, were charged with sexual assault after a 16-year-old girl from the Lower Mainland was allegedly attacked June 2.

The Squamish Nation agreed June 9 to a \$92.5 million deal to settle a court case with Ottawa over expropriated reserves, including 494 hectares given to Pacific Great Eastern Railway that now comprises downtown Squamish.

A crowd over 100 strong greeted the Western Canada Wilderness Committee's Wedge to the Ledge trek on the steps of Municipal Hall June 22, but dispersed as soon as WWC director Joe Foy began to speak.

Forestry workers on the coast, including Squamish, ended a two-week strike July 10 after a new collective agreement was reached.

One Whistler's study on the proposal to create a 500,000-hectare national park including the upper Elaho drew fire from other local governments, even though it recommended against a park.

Community fear, or hope, of a big box store was raised as Canadian Tire was revealed July 18 as the anchor tenant for a mall development on Hwy. 99 at Mamquam Road.

Neighbours, police. Search

and Rescue, Squamish Nation Peacekeepers and the local canine unit spent about an hour July 17 for a missing four-year-old girl.

The most elaborate blockade of the year in the Elaho Valley ended Aug. 2 when four tree-sitters abandoned their perch some 100 metres above the Lava Creek gorge after eight days.

The crash of a Glacier Air plane into Howe Sound Aug. 6 was not to be the subject of an investigation, the Transportation Safety Board announced Aug. 10.

The engine on the Cessna 206 apparently quit five minutes into a 30-minute flight from the Squamish Airport, forcing the pilot to do an emergency landing. All four occupants escaped safely.

The Squamish Estuary Management Plan became final Aug. 21 when the Squamish Nation, provincial government and BCR Group of Companies agreed to the terms of a critical land swap.

Local John Robert Vinson, 21, died Aug. 22 when the stolen 1986 Nissan pickup he was driving crossed the centre line and smashed at high speed into a dump truck on Government Road.

Vinson was apparently unaware that the truck had been stolen, allegedly by the truck's passenger.

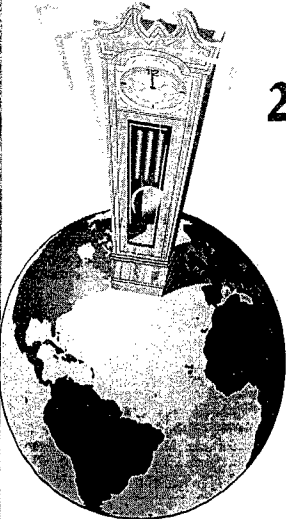

Year in Review

The year in briefs

September-December

A land purchase agreement between the Howe Sound Educational Foundation and Merrill & Ring for the private university project was announced Sept. 5.

Local doctors joined the growing number of physicians across B.C. threatening to withdraw services if their concerns with health care funding are not met.

A year in jail became the new record for a contempt of court conviction after Barney Kern and Betty Krawczyk were sentenced after being found guilty of breaching an injunction against interfering with Interfor's harvesting.

CHIPS celebrated Sept. 20 as a judge quashed the devel-

opment permit granted to G.B.A. Logging for its controversial wood chip handling facility because the wording of light industrial zoning did not allow the proposed use.

The jury-rigged wiring of an undiscovered marijuana growing operation apparently caused a fire that gutted one of Squamish's oldest homes Oct. 3.

Twenty-five per cent of Squamish came out to vote Oct. 14 on airport development and fluoridation of the water supply.

The opinion question of allowing leases at the airport garnered a 56.7 per cent vote in favour.

Fluoridation, which required 50 per cent approval by law, failed with 60.9 per cent of voters in opposition.

An ugly and unresolved 34-year-old piece of Squamish history was finally laid to rest Oct. 27 when a jury convicted Byron Blue of the murder of 12-year-old Judy Howey in 1964.

As Blue was 15 when he murdered Howey on her way home from school, the jury's sentence of life in jail still means Blue is eligible for parole in five years.

The Squamish Forest District declared a 47-hectare sensitive area around some 80 trees estimated at up to 1,300 years of age in the upper Elaho.

BCRail announced up to 40 workers at its Squamish facilities will be laid off or transferred as it grapples with a \$40-million revenue shortfall.

A rock slide between Murrin and Shannon Falls provincial parks, about nine kilometres south of Squamish, closed Hwy. 99 for an hour and a half, though the traffic backlog took far longer to clear.

Alliance MP John Reynolds won re-election in the riding of West Vancouver-Sunshine Coast in the federal election Nov. 27.

Two people died in vehicle collisions on Hwy. 99 Nov. 30 and Dec. 1, forcing closures of the highway between Squamish and Vancouver.

A Squamish Nation elder perished in a house fire on the Stawamus Reserve Dec. 11. The fire was ruled accidental by investigators.

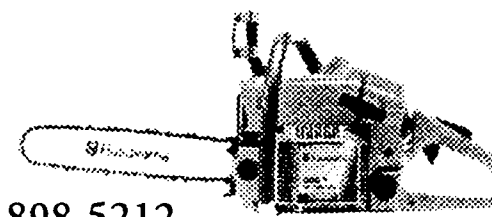

**EDITORIAL**

Story of the year continues

Last year we declared the trees of the Elaho Valley as Squamish's newsmakers of the year — with a note that the story of 1999 would likely also be the story of 2000.

But while the forest industry plays a dominant role in our story of the year in 2000, it's not the Elaho Valley that's our focus — rather, it's right in Squamish's town centre.

The proposed wood chip handling facility on Cattermole Slough first hit the headlines in March. Nine months later, it's still on the front pages, and in that time, it's spawned a new lobby group (Citizens for a Healthy, Innovative and Prosperous Squamish, or CHIPS), caused a lawsuit against proponent G.B.A. Logging Ltd. and the District of Squamish. The chip controversy goes much deeper than most scenarios where residents oppose a new industry. It's become a forestry issue, a legal issue, an issue of confidence in council, and at times it's threatened to become an issue of that bane of municipal politics, conflict of interest. As we predicted last year, the story of 2000 will be in large part the story of 2001. The chip controversy brought an abrupt end to the honeymoon of the newly-elected council, and also brought forth a potential new ground for municipal election candidates in 2002 — which suddenly seems closer than anyone had previously thought.

Let's see where the chips fall in the new year.

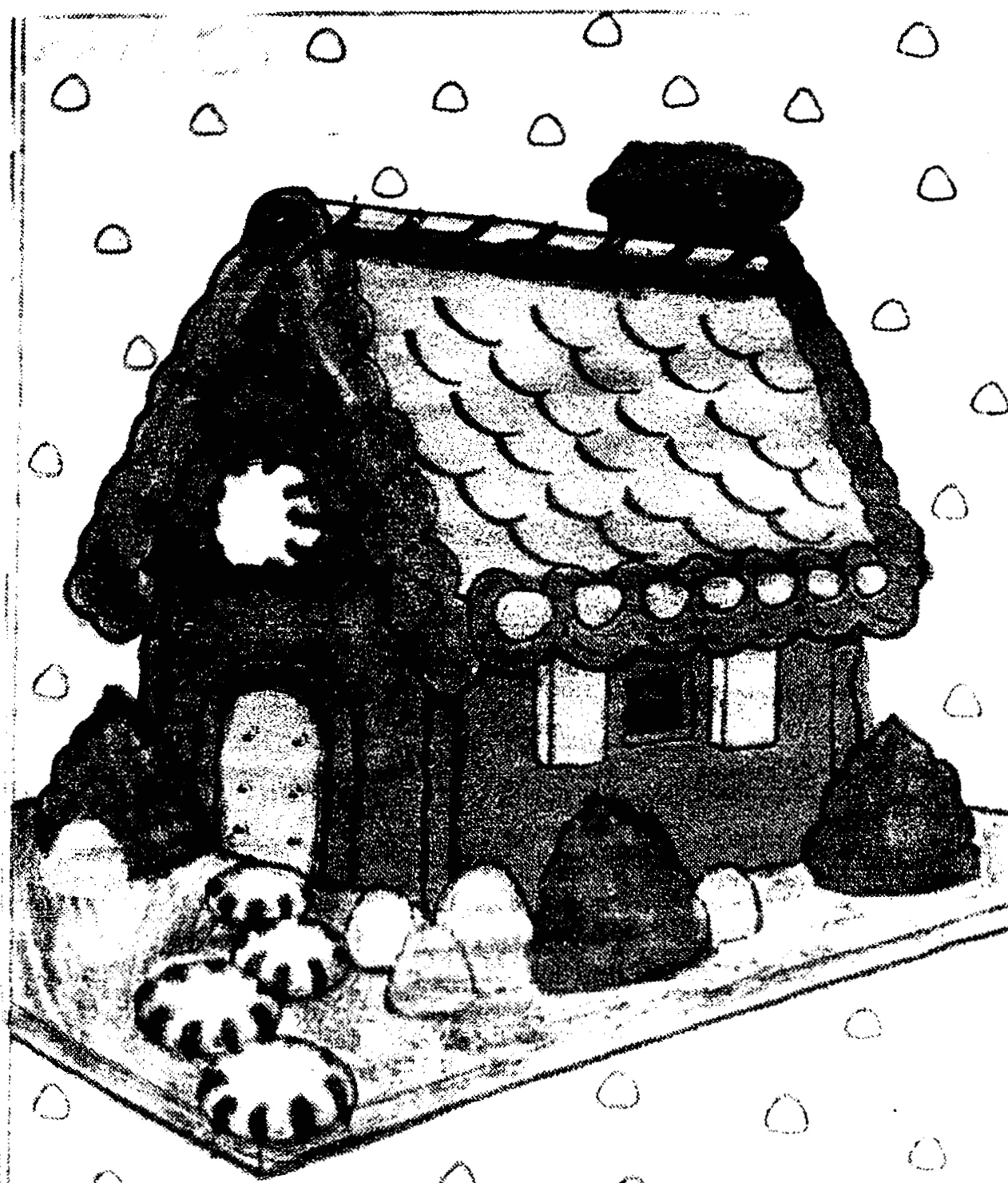

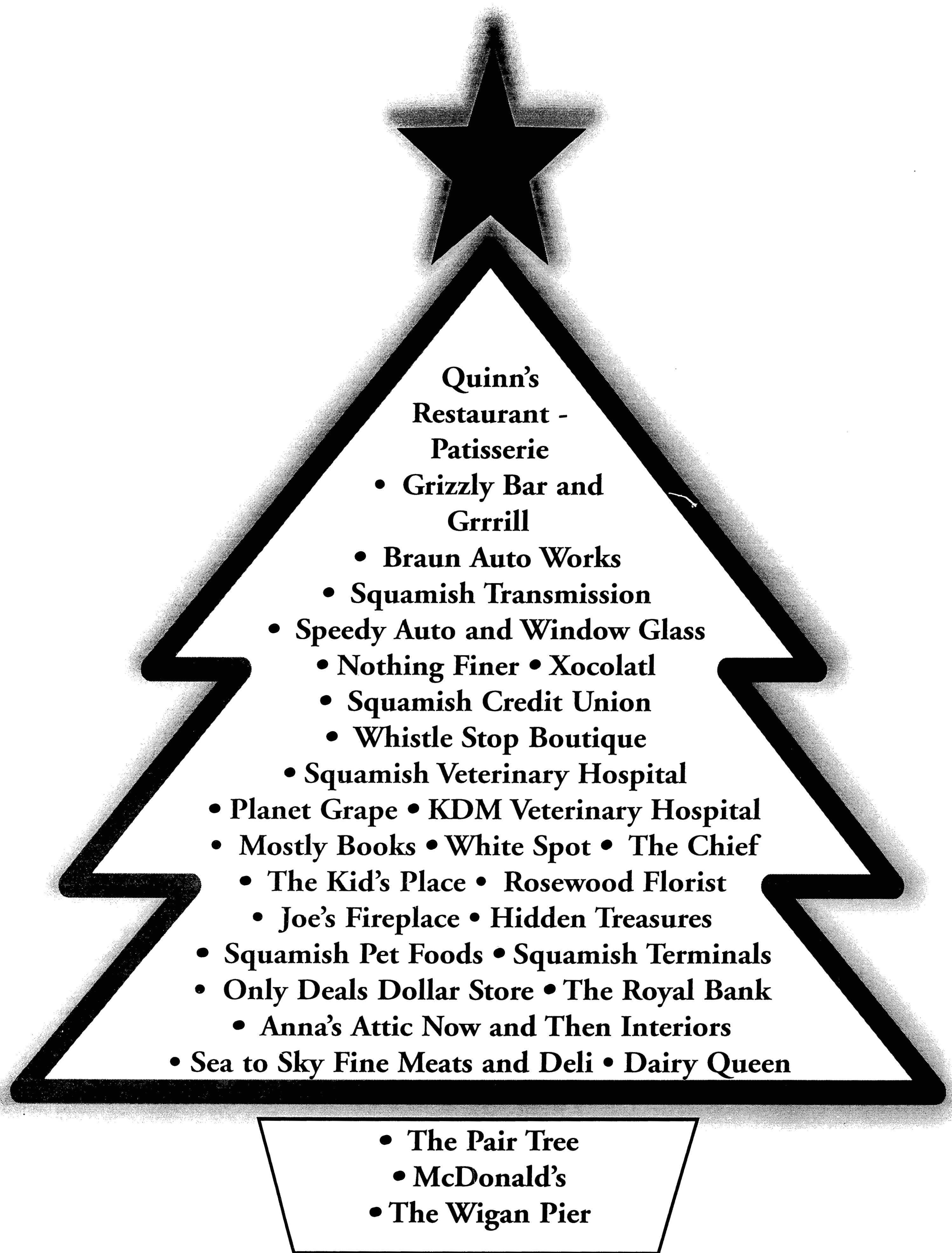

January

Keegan Murphy is flying high with a berth at the Canadian National Figure Skating Championships in Calgary.

The 14-year-old product of the Squamish Figure Skating Club picked up a gold medal at a major international competition in Norway — which he used to springboard his chances at a gold in Calgary.

Duncan MacDougall puts on a show for the home-town crowd, playing with the best midget hockey players in the Lower Mainland.

The 23rd Annual Midget Scholarship Tournament, presented by the Pacific Coast Amateur Hockey Association, played a game hosted by Squamish Minor Hockey at the Brennan Park Arena.

The Olympic boxing hopes of Squamish's Wayne Jackson crumble in a ring in St. Catherine's, Ont. as Jackson loses in the semifinals of the Canadian Amateur Boxing Championships.

February

The Brackendale Secondary School Girls curling team sweeps their way to the provincial championships.

The rookie team lands the berth with a 3-1 record at the North Shore Zone playdowns.

The Heliriggen Flyers are soaring in the Howe Sound Men's Hockey League as they clinch first place in the league two weeks before the end of the regular season.

The Flyers sit with a record of 21-4-2, seven points clear of second-place McDonald's.

Squamish is well represented when the torch is lit in Quesnel to start the 2000 B.C. Winter Games.

No less than 12 athletes and coaches from Squamish compete in skiing, figure skating, hockey, squash, swimming and ringette. David Watson wins a bronze medal for squash and Adelle Brown wins a bronze in the pool.

March

The Howe Sound Eagles Old-timers hockey club conquer the world as the team grabs top spot in the Braun Division at the Canadian Adult Recreational Hockey Association World Cup Tournament the Great Pacific Forum in Delta.

Howe Sound defeated Norway 3-2 in a shoot-out to lay claim to the title.

The Bantam Rep Eagles

Minor Hockey Team heads to the provincials championships in Salmon Arm after winning the Pacific Coast Amateur Hockey Association AA play-off banner.

The Eagles finish seventh at the provincials with a record of 0-3-2.

McDonald's wins their second straight Howe Sound Men's Hockey League title defeating the Heliriggen Flyers in overtime in the final game. McDonald's wins the series 3-2-1 on an overtime goal by Aaron Ramage.

April

Longhorn Pub captures the G&T Pool and Spa Men's Soccer League regular season title with a record of 9-1-1 and then wins the Premiership Cup with a 2-1 (3-1 on penalty kicks) win over FC Khalsa.

Ellis Moving and Storage takes the Divisional Cup with a 4-2 win over Orange Crush.

Squamish's Laurie Aseltine and Heather Ray helped the B.C. Belle ringette team win a bronze medal at the 2000 Canadian Ringette Championships in Prince George. Laurie finished the tournament with four goals and eight points while Heather had one goal and six assists.

The Under-14 girls rep Squamish Scorpions records a perfect 17-0 season in local soccer action. The squad, formed in 1999, scored 60 goals and gave up only four in their romp through the league.

May

Kevin Hogg of Squamish wins First Gross at the 30th annual Men's Amateur Golf Championships at the Squamish Valley Golf and Country Club. The Lower Mainland's Scott Patton defeats Squamish's Ross Mader in a playoff for overall Low Net. Barry McKenzie of Squamish finished second in the Low net category.

July

It was deja vu at the finish line at the 2000 Test of Metal mountain bike race as Chad Miles from Whistler won his second straight title.

Courtney's Kiara Bisaro was also a repeat winner as she

captured her second straight women's title. Top Squamish rider was Dave Heisler from Team Corsa as he finished 13th overall among the 800 riders who participated.

Greg Gardner GM Men's Fastpitch club is on an impressive hot streak as they sweep a home double-header against the Vancouver Dawgs to run their record to 6-6 on the year. Gardner shows great pitching and defence during the two wins winning 5-0 and 4-1.

Record numbers take to the water, trails and streets of Squamish for the Third Annual Squamish Triathlon — a Memorial to Bob McIntosh. The 340-plus entries include 37 relay teams, with Graeme Martin-dale across the finish line first.

Squamish's Gord Addison is the first local across through the tape for fourth overall.

August

The Best Western Bulls complete an undefeated season in the Howe Sound Men's Fastball League with a 10-8 win over the Alta Lake Wizards in the championship game. The Bulls won the league title with a record of 24-0 and won all three of their playoff games.

September

Financial report forms are available at the Brennan Park Recreation Centre office for completion. Financial Beer Garden Reports must be received in writing within 30 days from the date of the actual Beer Garden Permit; failure to submit such written reports may result in the decline of any 2001 Beer Garden Permit Requests. NO other form of Financial Reporting will be accepted. Please return these completed forms to Bruce Goldsworthy, Manager, Recreation Services, Box 310, Squamish, B.C. V0N 3G0 or drop off at the Brennan Park Recreation Centre Office.

District of Squamish Beer Garden Policy Amendment

THAT prior to Beer Garden Permits being approved, conduct of the group in the previous year will be taken into consideration and the following information must be provided to the Parks and Recreation Commission for consideration along with the application.

1. A full financial accounting of all cash receipts from the previous years Beer Gardens and Tournaments be provided outlining all sales, expenses and dispersal of net profit from overall Beer Garden and Tournament expenses.
2. Any groups conducting a Beer Garden will be required to donate a minimum of 35% of net profit to a Squamish based community charity other than a group conducting the Beer Garden. Within the requirement of financial accounting the name of the charity must be listed indicating the amount donated along with a letter from the charity confirming receipt of the donation.
3. A Squamish based community charity is defined as any group within the community which provides social, athletic or other like services to the residents of Squamish for the "Community Good". Also qualifying within this definition is the ability for the organization to place the 35% of net profit into a Municipal Trust account reserved for improvements and enhancements to community facilities.
